CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO I MAGA'LAHEN GUÅHAN

This is to certify that Bill No. 74(EC), "AN ACT TO AMEND PUBLIC LAW 28-149 AND PUBLIC LAW 28-150, RELATIVE TO MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE OPERATIONS OF THE EXECUTIVE, LEGISLATIVE AND JUDICIAL BRANCHES OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM FOR THE FISCAL YEAR **ENDING** SEPTEMBER 30, 2007; TO AMEND GOVERNMENT'S REVENUE ESTIMATE FOR FISCAL YEAR 2007; TO AMEND CERTAIN FEES, CHARGES AND PENALTIES OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM; AND TO ENACTING MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS," was on the 4th day of May, 2007, duly and regularly passed.

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- Section 1. Effective Date. (a) The effective date for all fees, charges, penalties, provision, exemptions and moratoriums, excluding any de-appropriation penalties, contained in this Act shall be May 1, 2007.
- Public Notification. The Department of Revenue and Taxation, the (b) Guam Fire Department, the Department of Land Management, the Department of Labor, the Professional Engineers, Architects and Land Surveyors Board, the Contractors License Board, the Department of Parks and Recreation, and the Guam Police Department shall provide proper and timely public notice to the community regarding the new or adjusted fees, fines and penalties imposed by this Act. The 12 public notice shall include, but not be limited to, print media of general circulation and the agency's respective website. Said public notice shall be published and 13 posted no later than ten (10) working days after enactment of this Act. 14
 - Section 2. Annual Public Hearing Requirements on Fee Schedules. A new §3131 is added to Division 1, Chapter 3, Title 5 GCA as follows:
 - "§3131. Annual Public Hearing Requirements on Fee Schedules. All departments and agencies of the government of Guam that administer and collect fees for government services shall conduct a public hearing on existing fee schedules to receive and ascertain public opinion thereon within sixty (60) days of enactment of this Act. Beginning in 2008, all such departments and agencies shall conduct such hearings on an annual basis prior to April 1 of each year and shall regularly adjust existing fees, pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Act, or implement new fees for the purpose of cost recovery."

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MINUTES

In accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Law, a public hearing was held on Monday, March 30, 2015, at 10:00 a.m. in the GMHA Daniel L. Webb Conference Room, to solicit public opinion on the Hospital's 8,177 existing fees and 228 new rates, fees, and charges.

Note: Copies of the Public Hearing Agenda and the Listing of New Rates, Fees, and Charges were made available to all attendees.

I. Introduction

Ms. MaryAnn Palomo introduced herself as the Presiding Public Hearing Officer for this public hearing. Our public hearing recorder was Mrs. Candy Chan. Ms. Palomo began conducting the public hearing at 10:05 a.m.

II. Opening Remarks

On behalf of the GMHA Board of Trustees, the Interim Hospital Administrator/CEO, the Chief Financial Officer, and the GMHA employees, Ms. Palomo welcomed the public for attending the public hearing. She then commenced presenting the purpose of the public hearing today.

III. Purpose of the Public Hearing

As mandated by Public Law 29-02, Chapter V, Part IX, Section 2, §3131 enacted on May 18, 2007, all government departments and agencies shall conduct a public hearing, on an annual basis prior to April 1, on existing fee schedules and shall regularly adjust existing fees, pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Act, or implement new fees for the purpose of cost recovery.

In accordance with the enactment of Public Law 26-66 in December 2001, which removed the rate-setting jurisdiction from the PUC and gave it to the GMHA Board of Trustees:

10 GCA §80109 Hospital Rates

"(c) The Authority may establish interim fees for new, un-tariffed services, medication and supplies, without prior legislative approval and without compliance with the Administrative Adjudication Law; provided, that: (1) the interim fees are consistent with the Authority's Net Revenue Enhancement Engagement Pricing Model, as prepared by Deloitte & Touche, dated February 7, 1992, or such other protocol as may be approved by the Board of Trustees; and (2) a petition for permanent approval of the interim fees is filed by the Authority with I Liheslaturan Guahan within three (3) months of the Authority's establishment of the interim fee."

Ms. Palomo stated that in compliance with the Administrative Adjudication Law and further Guam Code Annotated directives, the Hospital did publish in the Pacific Daily News and the Marianas Variety the announcement of this public hearing and distributed the Notice of Public Hearing to all Hospital departments and units and also posted in public areas within the Hospital.

In addition, the Hospital also sent the Notice of Public Hearing via facsimiles and/or electronic mails to various media organizations and the Governor's Office, the Congresswoman, and to our elected Senators of the 33rd Guam Legislature. The Hospital also sent letters to the third party payers via facsimiles together with the listing of new fee items, inviting them to this public hearing.

The Hospital also posted the Notice of Public Hearing, the listing of new fee items and the existing fee schedules on its official website as mandated by public law.

IV. Presentation of Summary of New Fee Items

Mr. Frumen Patacsil introduced himself being in charge of the Hospital Charge Library. He presented at this public hearing a total of 8,177 existing Hospital fees, which were already adjudicated by the Legislature. Due to the volume of the existing fee schedules, we were unable to prepare copies for all attendees. The fee schedule is available on our website at www.gmha.org under Patient Portal – GMHA Fee Schedule. It is in PDF format and may be downloaded.

He also presented at this public hearing 228 new fees items. The new fee items were submitted by various hospital departments from December 2013 to February 2015. The summary of these new fee items are as follows:

He also informed that, effective April 1, 2015, the Hospital would also be updating 8,274 professional fees in our Charge Library. The professional fee schedule is available on our website under Patient Portal – Professional Fee Schedule.

V. <u>Testimonies from the Public</u>

Ms. Palomo noted that no attendees from the public had signed up for testimony. She informed that the public could submit a written testimony to the Hospital Administrator/CEO within five (5) days after this public hearing. These testimonies would be incorporated into the submission package to the 33rd Guam Legislature, subsequent to the approval by the GMHA Board of Trustees.

VI. <u>Questions and Answers on the Proposed New Rates, Fees and Charges and Existing Fee Schedules</u>

Ms. Palomo commenced soliciting from the public for any questions they might have concerning the 8,177 existing fees and the 228 new fee items presented at this public hearing today.

Ricky Martin of TakeCare Insurance inquired if the Hospital's fees were based on current Medicare rate. Mr. Patacsil responded that the Hospital is using the Deloitte & Touche pricing model based on the landed cost multiplied by mark up. Mr. Martin requested if the pricing model was available for review. Mr. Patacsil responded that it is available for review.

Jeffrey Larsen of Takecare inquired if there is an equivalent in terms of Medicare PFR or some other methodology adjustment that would be analogues to Deloitte's model or audit. Mr. Patacsil responded that Deloitte did not do a Medicare comparison but an analysis for the Hospital. He would conduct a research on the equivalent fees and provide a response.

Anthony Mendiola of StayWell inquired about the adjustment of professional fee, especially if Anesthesiology service would be affected. Mr. Patacsil responded that Anesthesiology service would not be affected.

Mr. Larsen also inquired if the professional fees were greater than 5%, or capped at 5%. Mr. Patacsil responded that the Hospital is using the 2015 Physicians' Fee Reference (PFR) at 50th percentile plus geographic multiplier, but would not include the additional 5%.

Ms. Palomo added that the 5% across the board increase is only on hospital/facility fees and would not affect the professional fees. Mr. Patacsil would provide his confirmation.

Frank Campillo of Selectcare requested the Hospital to notify the payers at least a quarter in advance for any proposed fees or fee increase before implementation. Mr. Mizusawa responded that the Hospital would present the request to the Board of Trustees to make the decision and would provide a response. He added that for next year, it is reasonable for the Hospital to disclose to the insurers any fee increase to the insurance 90 days in advance to ensure they have time to assure the fees are accurate. He would present to the Board of Trustees for fees disclosure approval for next year or any other fee increases.

Mr. Larsen reminded that the Hospital had the 90-day agreement with the insurers for the Urgent Care fees. With the new set of fees in place, he asked if the Hospital would bring the insurers back for discussion and if this set of new fees were higher than the originally agreed fees. Mr. Patacsil responded that the fees should be at Medicare rates +30%. He would verify and

confirm. Ms. Palomo added that she would discuss with the Chief Financial Officer as to scheduling the meeting with the insurers.

Mr. Larsen also inquired if the Urgent Care fees proposed 90 days ago and the new fees were set for the rest of the fiscal year. Dr. Lizama responded that these fees were subject to re-evaluation and would depend on the Hospital's decision how to move forward. He indicated that we would need to have a contract based on the agreement. He would discuss with the Hospital's Chief Financial Officer to develop the contract that would allow us to move forward as a participating urgent care provider. The Hospital would provide a response later.

Mr. Larsen expressed his statement that the Hospital's proposed new fees are keeping pace with market rates, especially for those new services that replace the old products. Dr. Lizama commented that he did not know about that statement.

Mr. Campillo inquired if the Telemetry Observation Room and Board rate at \$97.50 per hour was correct. Mr. Patacsil stated that it should have been a pro-rate of about \$31.00+ per hour, which he would be amending the rate as soon as possible.

Ms. Palomo reminded that the public would have five days to submit their written testimonies to the Hospital Administrator and that Mr. Patacsil would follow up on some of the questions and would provide a response to the insurers.

VII. Closing Remarks

In closing, Ms. Palomo thanked everyone for making the time in their busy schedules to attend this public hearing. We would notify in advance of any future public hearings regarding fees.

VIII. Adjournment

Ms. Palomo called the hearing to adjourn at 10:48 a.m.
