SENIOR CITIZENS MONTH 2015

The Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS), Division of Senior Citizens (DSC) coordinated and/or facilitated the events to celebrate Senior Citizens Month (SCM) 2015, which is observed annually in May. The theme for this year's month-long celebration, "Get into the Act" was derived from the official theme for the national celebration of Older Americans Month 2015, as developed by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Community Living. In Chamorro, the translated theme is "Saonao Gi Kinalamten." The theme focuses on how older adults are taking charge of their health, getting engaged in their communities, and making a positive impact in the lives of others.

To lead in the planning of SCM, Mrs. Geraldine T. Gumataotao of the Division of Senior Citizens was appointed this year's Chairperson, and with the support of the Health Services of the Pacific (HSP), Mrs. Kavita Hemlani Ré Co-Chaired the SCM Central Planning Committee (CPC) meetings. The meetings convened at the DSC on December 30, 2014. Thereafter, the CPC met twice monthly through April 21, 2015, with the closeout meeting held on Tuesday, June 23, 2015. Members of the CPC included representatives from government agencies and departments and private and non-profit entities, to include: HSP - Service Provider for the National Family Caregiver Support Program; Catholic Social Service (CSS) - Service Provider for the Case Management Services, Adult Day Care, In-Home Services, and the Emergency Receiving Home Programs; Mayors' Council of Guam (MCOG) - Senior Center Operations Program; Kloppenburg Enterprises, Inc. - Vendor for the Transportation Services Program; 33rd Guam Legislature - Office of Speaker Judith T. Won Pat, Ed.D. and the Office of Senator Dennis G. Rodriguez, Jr.; Santa Rita Mayors' Office; St. Dominic's Senior Care Home; Guam Fire Department; Lions Club International – District 204; GovGuam Association of Retired Person; American Association of Retired Persons (AARP) - Guam Chapter; Guam Visitors Bureau (GVB) and staff of the DPHSS DSC and Division of Public Health, Bureau of Family Health and Nursing Services.

GETTING THE WORD OUT

This year, DSC staff and members of the 2015 SCM CPC made appearances on both radio and television talk shows to share information about the senior citizens month events. Shows included: KTKB 101.9 FM Megamixx, Damdaming Pinoy Show, KUAM News Weekend Edition, K57 AM Patti Arroyo Show, and KISH 102.9 FM.

DSC also promoted participation of SCM events by displaying outdoor vinyl banners proclaiming May as SCM on a billboard at the Paseo Loop. The Department of Parks and Recreation is recognized for waiving the permit fees associated with the Paseo Loop billboard reservation. Additionally, there was media coverage in the Guam Pacific Daily News (PDN), Guam Super Shopper, and KUAM. A traveling banner was also displayed at each SCM event.

The following are the highlights of the celebration of Senior Citizens Month 2015:

PROCLAMATION SIGNING

The Honorable Ray Tenorio, Lt. Governor of Guam signed Proclamation 2015-35 at the Santa Rita Senior Citizens Center on April 28, 2015, officially proclaiming the month of May 2015 as Senior Citizens Month (SCM). For over twenty-five years, the month-long observance is celebrated with activities recognizing the achievements, contributions and longevity of our *man'amko*.

The coordination of the Proclamation Signing was led by the Division of Senior Citizens, DPHSS, in collaboration with the Office of the Governor and Mayor Dale E. Alvarez, Municipality of Santa Rita and the *seniors* from the Santa Rita Senior Citizens Center. For the past 10 years, to include this year's event, the proclamation signing for Senior Citizens' Month has taken place at one (1) of twelve (12) Senior Citizens Centers. The village center designated to host the proclamation event is selected in the order it became a Senior Citizens Center (i.e., Sinajana was the first Senior Citizens Center on Guam, thus in 2006, Proclamation Signing was held at the Sinajana Center; in 2007, the Proclamation Signing was held at the Mangilao Senior Citizens Center, etc.), as illustrated below in Table 1. Senior Citizens Month Proclamation Signing Ceremonies. As the Governor is invited to proclaim Senior Citizens Month at the designated village Senior Citizens Center, the participants graciously host the event. Two (2) of the twelve (12) Senior Citizens Centers remain on the list to host a Proclamation Singing event: Merizo and Agana Heights Senior Citizens Center.

4TH ANNUAL GUAM CONFERENCE ON AGING (GCOA)

The DSC/DPHSS with support from the Guam Medicare Assistance Program and the Guam Senior Medicare Patrol Project along with the SCM Central Planning Committee hosted the 4th Annual Guam Conference on Aging as part of the annual celebration of SCM. The Conference was chaired by DSC staff Mrs. Joleen M.M. Almandres and co-chaired by DSC's Ms. Cathy Bayona. PRE-CONFERENCE ACTIVITIES

Pre-Conference activities included line dancing as a morning energizer; a skit performed by Suzie Arceo, Mary Torres and Recreational Leader Ken San Agustin of the Sinajana Senior Citizens Center and singing by participants of the same center, as well as a video montage of center participants from various Senior Citizens Centers welcoming everyone to the Guam Conference on Aging.

CONFERENCE ACTIVITIES

After Mr. and Mrs. Torres (Joe and Mary) of the Sinajana Senior Citizens Center sang the National Anthem and Guam Hymn, Senior Citizens Administrator Arthur U. San Agustin delivered the Opening Remarks for the Conference. It was followed by the Welcoming Remarks by DPHSS Director James Gillan and the Keynote Address by Honorable Eddie B. Calvo, Governor of Guam. After his address, Governor Calvo swore-in 10 of the newly appointment members of the Guam Council on Senior Citizens. The Council serves as advocates for the island's Manamko and provides guidance to the Senior Citizens Administrator on aging related issues.

The conference topics focused on leading adults to make a positive impact in the lives of others. The first conference presentation commenced with "Positive Impact on the Lives of Others" by Mr. David Peredo, Disaster Program Manager for the American Red Cross



and followed by "Getting Engaged in their Communities" by Ms. Peggy Denney of i*recycle. During lunch, entertainment was provided by the Merizo and Santa Rita Senior Citizens Center participants. After lunch, the Guam Senior Medicare Patrol Project & Guam State Health Insurance Assistance Program recognized their volunteers and partners for their hard work and dedication in support of the division's Medicare based programs.
