Dear Madame Speaker:

Attached is Bill No. 222-33 (COR), entitled, "An Act to Amend Sections 6207 AND 6207.1 and to New Sections 6218.2 and 6218.3 to Chapter 6, Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated, Relative to Prohibiting Bonus Pay and Mandating Proper Pay and Pay Adjustment Processing for Unclassified Employees," which I have **VETOED**.

The reason for my veto is that as passed and submitted, Bill No. 222 specifically identifies and treats the unclassified employees of the Governor and Lt. Governor's offices who receive increases in base pay differently than unclassified employees in the rest of the government who receive similar increases, including employees in the legislative and judicial branches. Bill 222 additionally ignores the massive spike in payments caused by the practice of unclassified employees at the Legislature who regularly cash out lump sum annual leave at the end of every term.

Prudent, responsible fiscal management is the obligation of every government entity, including the legislative and judicial branches. Whether classified or unclassified, the hard working Government of Guam employees deserve to be treated equally and fairly regardless of which branch or agency they serve in. 

I know that the legislative and judicial branches share with the executive branch the same goal of government-wide financial stability and parity. And I trust that they will not hesitate to step up and take action as necessary to ensure that the Government of Guam is operated responsibly and equitably. As public servants, we owe the People no less.

AN ACT TO *AMEND* SECTIONS 6207 AND 6207.1 OF AND TO *ADD* NEW SECTIONS 6218.2 AND 6218.3 TO CHAPTER 6, TITLE 4 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO PROHIBITING BONUS PAY AND MANDATING PROPER PAY AND PAY ADJUSTMENT PROCESSING FOR UNCLASSIFIED EMPLOYEES; AND TO *ADD* NEW SUBSECTIONS 1119(A)(I) AND 1119(D) TO CHAPTER 1, TITLE 2 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED; AND TO *ADD* NEW SUBSECTIONS 4102(D) AND 4109(I) TO CHAPTER 4, TITLE 4 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED; AND TO *ADD* NEW SUBSECTION 2102(A) TO CHAPTER 2, TITLE 7 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO PROHIBITING THE LUMP SUM PAYMENT OF ANNUAL LEAVE FOR UNCLASSIFIED EMPLOYEE POSITIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Prologue and Intent. In 2010, the Hay Group conducted a

- 3 comprehensive study on the Government of Guam pay plan. Because of the fiscal
- 4 environment in 2011, full implementation of the plan was delayed until the
- 5 government's financial condition improved. A partial pay adjustment for
- 6 employees on the General Pay Plan, and full pay adjustments for nurses, teachers,

1	and government attorneys, was implemented on January 26, 2014. Immediately	
2	thereafter, the Legislature repealed a portion of the pay adjustment for elected	
3	officials (namely the Governor, the Lt. Governor, Senators, and the Attorney	
4	General and the Public Auditor), and cabinet heads. (P.L. 32-136). In September	
5	2014, full pay adjustment for the General Pay Plan employees was implemented.	
6	In June 2014, Public Law 32-166 was passed, and pay adjustments were	
7	implemented for the Judiciary, retroactive to January 2014. In November 2014,	
8	the Legislature repealed P.L. 32-136, which had disallowed pay raises for elected	
9	officials and cabinet heads, reinstating their pay raises retroactive to January 2014.	
10	(P.L. 32-208). Thus, by November 2014, the Legislature, the Judiciary and every	
11	line agency of the Executive branch had received pay adjustments effective on or	
12	retroactive to January 2014. The only exception, other than the Public Auditor	
13	was the 107 rank and file employees of the Governor's Office and the Lt.	
14	Governor's Office.	
15	Recognizing the inequality in excluding these hard working employees,	
16	many of whom took a voluntary 10% pay cut and were instrumental in the	
17	turnaround of the government's finances, I Maga'Låhen Guåhan implemented	
18	salary adjustments for the staff of the Governor's Office and the Lt. Governor's	
19	Office to bring their salaries in line with the January 2014 retroactive adjustment	
20	that was made for all the other Government of Guam employees. These employees	

were not included in P.L. 32-208 because their salaries are not set by statute, thus
 they need not be amended by statute.

Had politics not played a part in the implementation of the Hay Study, 3 Adelup employees, whose salaries are pegged to the Governor and the Lt. 4 Governor's salaries, would have received their raises in January 2014, along with 5 all the other employees of the government. However, because the executive 6 7 salaries were not adjusted until December, retroactive to January, I Maga'Låhen Guåhan elected to adjust the Governor and Lt. Governor's staff salaries pursuant to 8 9 the authority of 4 G.C.A. Section 6207. The Attorney General determined that the processing mistakes made by 10 11 DOA gave the pay adjustments the appearance of retroactivity, which is disallowed except where permitted by legislation, such as was previously done for employees 12 of the OPA, the Judiciary, the Governor, the Lt. Governor, the Senators, the 13 directors and deputy directors. law enforcement personnel, National Guard and 14 reserve employees, mayors and vice mayors. Following the AG's counsel, I 15 Maga'Låhen Guåhan moved to correct the retroactive appearance in the Adelup 16 pay adjustments. 17 In January, 2016, the Legislature passed Bill 222-33, which sought to 18

19 prohibit bonus pay and regulate the processing of pay adjustments for the

20 unclassified staff of the Governor and Lt. Governor's offices only. Bill 222-33

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ignored, however, spikes caused by unclassified employees at the Legislature who
 regularly cash out lump sum annual leave at the end of every term.

It is unfair to single out the employees of a single agency in a single Executive branch when there are other unclassified employees in the legislative and judiciary branches who are similarly situated. It therefore the express intent of this bill to provide for parity across all three branches of government and in every agency, including autonomous and semiautonomous agencies, public corporations, and other public instrumentalities of the Government of Guam; and further to insure that fiscal management is applied equally and equitably.

Section 2. § 6207, Chapter 6, Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read:

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"§ 6207. Positions in Governor's Office.

13 The Governor is authorized to establish such positions as may be 14 necessary for the operation of the Office of the Governor including off 15 island offices and Government House; provided, however, that no person 16 shall be appointed to fill such a position in the absence of an appropriation to 17 pay the salary set for such position. The Governor shall set the salaries for 18 positions for which salaries are not set by law which shall be paid in twenty-19 six (26) equal installments from the date when such salary was set." Section 3. § 6207.1, Chapter 6, Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated is
 hereby *amended* to read:

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"§ 6207.1. Positions in Lieutenant Governor's Office.

The Lieutenant Governor is authorized to establish such positions as 4 may be necessary for the operation of the Office of the Lieutenant Governor, 5 the Guam State Clearinghouse, and other offices that are established and 6 placed under the purview or direction of the Lieutenant Governor of Guam; 7 provided, however, that no person shall be appointed to fill such a position 8 in the absence of an appropriation to pay the salary set for such position. The 9 Lieutenant Governor shall set the salaries for positions for which salaries are 10 11 not set by law which shall be paid in twenty-six (26) equal installments from the date when such salary was set." 12

13 Section 4. A new section 6218.2 is hereby *added* to Chapter 6, Title 4 of 14 the Guam Code Annotated to read:

15 <u>"§ 6218.2. Prohibition on Bonus Pay for Unclassified Employe</u>	
16	No bonuses shall be authorized and/or paid in lump sum or otherwise,
17	to unclassified employees in all branches of the government of Guam unless
18	so specified by law. Any person who authorizes a bonus payment in
19	violation of this Section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. For the purposes
20	of this Section, bonuses or bonus payments shall mean sums authorized

1	and/or paid to an unclassified employee that is separate and apart from		
2	and/or added to the base pay of such unclassified employee for any		
3	purpose."		
4	Section 5. A new section 6218.3 is hereby added to Chapter 6, Title 4 of		
5	the Guam Code Annotated to read:		
6	"§ 6218.3. Processing of Pay Adjustments for Unclassified Employees.		
7	Pay adjustments that increase base pay that are authorized pursuant to		
8	§§ 6207 and 6207.1 for all unclassified positions, officers and employees in		
9	the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Branches, inclusive of autonomous		
10	and semiautonomous agencies, public corporations, and other public		
11	instrumentalities of the government of Guam shall be paid in twenty-six (26)		
12	equal installments from the date when such pay adjustment was authorized.		
13	If, after such pay adjustments that increase base pay for such unclassified		
14	employees that are authorized pursuant to §§ 6207 and 6207.1 of this		
15	Chapter, a pay adjustment is authorized to decrease base pay within two (2)		
16	pay periods, the amount of such pay adjustment that previously increased		
17	base pay shall be repaid by the unclassified employee no later than the		
18	following pay period subsequent to the date from when the pay adjustment		
19	decrease was authorized."		

1	Section 6. A new subsection 1119(a)(i) is hereby added to subsection	
2	1119(a), Chapter 1, Title 2 of the Guam Code Annotated to read:	
3	"§ 1119(a)(i). Positions in the Legislature.	
4	The Legislature shall set the salaries for all its employees to be paid in	
5	twenty-six (26) equal installments from the date when such salary was set."	
6	Section 7. A new subsection 1119(d) is hereby added to section 1119,	
7	Chapter 1, Title 2 of the Guam Code Annotated to read:	
8	"§ 1119(d). Lump Sum Payment of Annual Leave Prohibited.	
9	No legislative employee who leaves the government's service for any	
10	reason shall receive a cash payment for annual leave accrued at the time that	
	the employee leaves such service."	
12	Section 8. A new subsection 4102(e) is hereby added to section 4102,	
13	Chapter 4, Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated to read:	
14	"Section 4102(e). Lump Sum Payment of Annual Leave Prohibited.	
15	As defined by Section 4102(a), no person in an unclassified position	
16	who leaves the government's service for any reason shall receive a cash	
17	payment for annual leave accrued at the time that person leaves such	
18	service."	
19	Section 9. A new subsection 4109(i) is hereby added to section 4109,	
20	Chapter 4. Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated to read:	

1	"Subsection 4109(i). Lump Sum Payment of Annual Leave Prohibited
2	for Unclassified Positions.
3	As defined by Section 4102(a) of this Chapter, no person in an
4	unclassified position who leaves the government's service for any reason
5	shall receive a cash payment for annual leave accrued at the time that person
6	leaves such service."
7	Section 10. A new subsection 2102(a) is hereby added to section 2102,
8	Chapter 2, Title 7 of the Guam Code Annotated to read:
9	"§ 2102(a). Lump Sum Payment of Annual Leave Prohibited.
10	No judiciary employee who leaves the government's service for any
11	reason shall receive a cash payment for annual leave accrued at the time that
12	the employee leaves such service."
13	Section 11. Effective Date. This Act shall become effective upon
14	enactment.
15	Section 12. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to
16	any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such
17	invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be
18	given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the
19	provisions of this Act are severable.

AN ACT TO AMEND §§ 6207 AND 6207.1, AND TO ADD NEW §§ 6218.2 AND 6218.3 OF ARTICLE 2, CHAPTER 6 OF TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO PROHIBITING BONUS PAY AND MANDATING PROPER PAY AND PAY ADJUSTMENT PROCESSING FOR UNCLASSIFIED EMPLOYEES OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. § 6207 of Article 2, Chapter 6 of Title 4, Guam Code
Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read:

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"§ 6207. Positions in *I Maga'låhi's* (the Governor's) Office.

I Maga'låhi (the Governor) is authorized to establish such positions as 1 may be necessary for the operation of the Office of I Maga'låhi (the 2 3 Governor), including off-island offices and Government House; provided, however, that no person shall be appointed to fill such a position in the 4 5 absence of an appropriation to pay the salary set for such position. I 6 Maga'låhi (the Governor) shall set the salaries for positions for which 7 salaries are not set by law, which *shall* be paid in twenty-six (26) biweekly 8 equal installments from the date when such salary was set."

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9 Section 2. § 6207.1 of Article 2, Chapter 6 of Title 4, Guam Code
10 Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read:

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"§ 6207.1. Positions in *I Segundu Na Maga'låhi's* (the Lieutenant Governor's) Office.

13 I Segundu Na Maga'låhi (the Lieutenant Governor) is authorized to 14 establish such positions as may be necessary for the operation of the Office of I Segundu Na Maga'låhi (the Lieutenant Governor), the Guam State 15 16 Clearinghouse, and other offices that are established and placed under the 17 purview or direction of I Segundu Na Maga'låhen Guåhan (the Lieutenant 18 Governor of Guam); provided, however, that no person shall be appointed to 19 fill such a position in the absence of an appropriation to pay the salary set for 20 such position. I Segundu Na Maga'låhi (the Lieutenant Governor) shall set 21 the salaries for positions for which salaries are not set by law, which shall be 22 paid in twenty-six (26) biweekly equal installments from the date when such 23 salary was set."

Section 3. A new § 6218.2 is hereby *added* to Article 2, Chapter 6 of Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

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"§ 6218.2. Prohibition on Bonus Pay for Unclassified Employees.

1 No bonuses shall be authorized and/or paid in lump-sum, or 2 otherwise, to unclassified employees of the government of Guam unless so 3 specified by law. Any person who authorizes a bonus payment in violation 4 of this Section *shall* be guilty of a misdemeanor. For the purposes of this 5 Section, bonuses or bonus payments *shall* mean sums authorized and/or paid 6 to an unclassified employee that is separate and apart from and/or added to 7 the base pay of such unclassified employee for any purpose."

8 Section 4. A new § 6218.3 is hereby *added* to Article 2, Chapter 6 of Title
9 4, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

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"§ 6218.3. Processing of Pay Adjustments for Unclassified Employees.

Pay adjustments that increase base pay that are authorized pursuant to 12 13 §§ 6207 and 6207.1 of this Chapter *shall* be paid in twenty-six (26) biweekly 14 equal installments from the date when such pay adjustment was authorized. If, after such pay adjustments that increase base pay for such unclassified 15 16 employees that are authorized pursuant to §§ 6207 and 6207.1 of this 17 Chapter, a pay adjustment is authorized to decrease base pay within two (2) 18 pay periods, the amount of such pay adjustment that previously increased base pay *shall* be repaid by the unclassified employee no later than the 19 20 following pay period subsequent to the date from when the pay adjustment 21 decrease was authorized."

22 Section 5. Effective Date. This Act *shall* become effective upon
23 enactment.

Section 6. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity *shall not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.

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
