Judgment against Government of Guam Government of Guam v. 162.40 Square Meters of Land

Dear Speaker Won Pat and Vice Speaker Cruz:

My law firm represents the Estate of Artemio M. Ilagan in Government of Guam v. 162.40 Square Meters of Land in the Municipality of Agana, Guam Superior Court Civil Case No. CV0863-81. In 1981, the Government of Guam condemned land being used as a parking lot for Mr. Ilagan's apartment building and conveyed the land to Mr. Ilagan's neighbor. The Government did this without conducting a proper just compensation survey or making an adequate deposit to pay for the property. The loss of the parking lot has resulted in a permanent loss of rental income for the Ilagan family. After years of litigation, a final judgment was issued by the court on June 23, 2016, awarding Mr. Ilagan's estate the amount of \$273,726.24 and post-judgment interest at the statutory rate. A copy of the Judgment is enclosed. The interest on the Judgment is accumulating at the rate of 6% per annum, equal to \$16,423.57 per year or approximately \$45.00 per day. To date, the Government has not paid the Judgment. To the best of my knowledge, the executive branch is unable to identify funds that could be used to pay this Judgment, and has not made any effort to obtain funding to do so.

No citizen should be compelled to go begging to the legislature for just compensation after the government has taken his land. Or as the highest court of one state has put it, no citizen should be compelled to trust to the future justice of the Legislature to provide just compensation owed for the taking of property. *Bromfield v. Treasurer and Receiver-General*, 459 N.E.2d 445,

448 (Mass. 1983). Unfortunately, that is the situation that the Ilagan family is in because of the government's failure (a) to conduct a proper just compensation appraisal before taking the family's property, (b) to make a deposit at the time of taking that was anywhere close to just compensation, and (c) to the best of my knowledge, to make any effort to obtain or identify funds to pay this Judgment. Therefore, I am writing to you on behalf of my clients to respectfully request that the Legislature appropriate funds to pay this Judgment. I know that in the past members of the Guam Legislature have taken a strong position in favor of just compensation for citizens of Guam whose land was taken by the federal government. The Ilagan family hopes that there will be a similar commitment on behalf of those whose land was taken by the Government of Guam.

Thank you for your attention to this matter. I look forward to hearing from you.

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
