WHEREAS, it is the intent of AMIM to allow our people of all the islands to share in its diversity and commonalities; and

WHEREAS, many festivals and events are held at different times of the year; and

WHEREAS, these activities and events are meant to be open to all the people of the Marianas; *now*, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the CNMI should publish these events in any media of public distribution in Guam; and be it further

RESOLVED, that these events should also be posted in the village news published weekly in Guam's media outlets; *and be it further*

RELATIVE TO REQUESTING THE GOVERNORS OF GUAM AND THE COMMONWEALTH OF THE NORTHERN MARIANA ISLANDS TO HOLD A NON-BINDING REFERENDUM IN 2018 REGARDING THE QUESTION ON THE REUNIFICATION OF THE MARIANA ISLANDS

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE AMIM 23RD GENERAL ASSEMBLY:

WHEREAS, the first people of the Mariana Islands immigrated at some point between 4000 BC and 2000 BC from Southeast Asia and after the first contact with Spaniards, they eventually became known as the Chamorros, a Spanish word similar to Chamori, the name of the indigenous caste system's higher division; and

WHEREAS, the ancient people of the Marianas raised colonnades of megalithic capped pillars called latte stones upon which they built their homes and the Spanish reported that by the time of their arrival, the largest of these were already in ruins, and that the Chamorros believed the ancestors who had erected the pillars lived in an era when people possessed supernatural abilities; and

WHEREAS, Archeologists in 2013 posited that the first people to settle in the Marianas may have made what was at that point the longest uninterrupted ocean-crossing voyage in human history, and that archeological evidence indicates Tinian may have been the first Pacific island outside of Asia to have been settled; and

WHEREAS, after its loss during the Spanish–American War of 1898, Spain ceded Guam to the United States and sold the remainder of the Marianas (i.e., the Northern Marianas), along with the Caroline Islands, to Germany under the German–Spanish Treaty of 1899, and

WHEREAS, Germany administered the islands as part of its colony of German New Guinea and did little in terms of development; and

WHEREAS, Early in World War I, Japan declared war on Germany and invaded the Northern Marianas. In 1919, the League of Nations awarded all of Germany's islands in the Pacific Ocean located north of the Equator, including the Northern Marianas, under mandate to Japan. Under this arrangement, the Japanese thus administered the Northern Marianas as part of the South Pacific Mandate; and

WHEREAS, On December 8, 1941, hours after the attack on Pearl Harbor, Japanese forces from the Marianas launched an invasion of Guam and Chamorros from the Northern Marianas, which had been under Japanese rule for more than 20 years, were brought to Guam to assist the Japanese administration and this,

combined with the harsh treatment of Guamanian Chamorros during the 31-month occupation, created a rift that would become the main reason Guamanians rejected the reunification referendum approved by the Northern Marianas in the 1960s; and

WHEREAS; after Japan's defeat in World War II, the Northern Marianas were administered by the United States pursuant to Security Council Resolution 21 as part of the United Nations Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, which gave responsibility for defense and foreign affairs to the United States. Four referenda offering integration with Guam or changes to the islands' status were held in 1958, 1961, 1963 and 1969 and on each occasion, a majority voted in favor of integration with Guam. But this did not happen: Guam rejected integration in a 1969 referendum and the people of the Northern Mariana Islands decided in the 1970s not to seek independence, but instead to forge closer links with the United States and negotiations for territorial status began in 1972 and a covenant to establish a commonwealth in political union with the United States was approved in a 1975 referendum and new government and constitution came into effect in 1978 after being approved in a 1977 referendum and the United Nations approved this arrangement pursuant to Security Council Resolution 683; and

WHEREAS; the AMIM feel it is time to create a joint commission on political status with the help of assistance of the University of Guam, the Guam Community College and the Northern Mariana College to study the financial and legal impacts of having two different governments for the same people, having more in common within their historical heritage than is different with some solid numbers in hand, perhaps it would be time to once again address the question: Shall the Mariana Islands be reunified?; and

WHEREAS; it is the AMIM desire to request our respective executive branch leaders to organize and host a referendum at the next general election guided by town halls, public input and testimony and comprehensive educational studies and reports on the benefits and drawback of reunification; *now*, therefore be it

RESOLVED; AMIM requests the governors of Guam and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands to hold a non-binding referendum in 2018 regarding the questions on the reunification of the Mariana Islands; *and be it further*

RESOLVED, that the President certify to and the Vice President attest to the adoption hereof and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to the Speaker of *I Mina Trentai Tres Na Liheslaturan Guåhan*; and to *I Maga Låhen Guåhan*, and to the Governor of Northern Mariana Islands and the President of the CNMI Senate, the Speaker of the Legislature of the Northern Mariana Islands, Guam Delegate and CNMI Delegate to the U.S. Congress.

RELATIVE TO ALLOWING THE IMPORTATION OF "3 YEAR COCONUT TREES" DUE TO COCONUT RHINOCEROUS BEETLE INFESTATION.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE AMIM 23RD GENERAL ASSEMBLY:

WHEREAS, to formulate and implement an accelerated coconut replanting program aimed at increasing farm productivity to include rehabilitation of existing coconut trees; and

WHEREAS, the coconut tree, known as the "tree of life" is quickly being destroyed by the invasive species Rhinoceros Beetle; and

WHEREAS, if this destruction is allowed to continue, there will be no "tree of life" left on Guam; and

WHEREAS, the islands of the Northern Marianas have an abundance of coconut trees including the 3-year coconut trees; *now*, *therefore be it*

RESOLVED, that AMIM expresses its support to any policy or regulation that will allow the importation of the 3 year coconut tree into Guam from the Northern Marianas; *and be it further*
