Substitute Bill by Committee on Judiciary

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 7001, 7101, 7102, 7103, AND 7104 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, TO REPEAL SECTION 7100 OF SAID CODE, AND TO ADD A NEW SECTION 7005 TO SAID CODE, RELATIVE TO THE ORGANIZATION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LAW.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 7001 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 7001. Department of Iaw, cognizance. The
Department of Iaw shall have cognizance of all legal matters
in which the government of Guam is in anywise interested.
The Attorney General shall not delegate to any attorney in
private practice in Guam the collection of any account or
other obligation owing to the government of Guam, or to any
agency or instrumentality thereof. It shall have cognizance
of all matters pertaining to public prosecution."

Section 2. A new Section 7005 is hereby added to the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"Section 7005. Divisions of Office. The Department of Law is composed of a Criminal Division and a Civil Division, under the general cognizance of the Attorney General. Each division shall be headed by a Deputy Attorney General. Every reference in law, rule or regulation to the Island Attorney, as to criminal matters, shall read and mean the Deputy Attorney General in charge of the Criminal Division. Every reference in law, rule or regulation to the Island Attorney as to civil matters, shall be read and mean the Deputy Attorney General in charge of the Civil Division."

Section 3. Section 7100 is hereby repealed in its entirety.

Section 4. Section 7101 of the Government Code of Guam is 1 hereby amended to read as follows: 3 4 5 6 8 are prosecuted in the Police Court; 9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 Guam; 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34

"Section 7101. Duties. The Attorney General is the public prosecutor and, by himself or a deputy, shall:

- (1) Conduct on behalf of the government of Guam the prosecution of all offenses against the laws of Guam which are prosecuted in the District Court or the Island Court and the prosecution of those offenses which
- (2) Institute proceedings for the arrest of persons charged with or reasonably suspected of offense under the # laws of Guam, when he has information that any such offenses have been committed; and for that purpose, when not engaged in criminal proceedings in the courts or in civil cases on behalf of the government of Guam, may attend preliminary investigations before the Director of Public Safety or before any magistrate in cases of arrest;
- (3) Draw all informations, conduct grand jury proceedings, conduct on behalf of the government of Guam all civil actions in which the government is a party or interested, prosecute all recognizances forfeited in the courts and all actions for the recovery of debts, fines, penalties, and forfeitures accruing to the government of
- (4) Deliver receipts for money or property received by him in his official capacity and file duplicates thereof with the Director of Revenue and Taxation;
- (5) As soon as practical after the receipt of any money in his official capacity, turn the money over to the Director of Revenue and Taxation, and on the first Monday of each month file with the Director of Revenue and Taxation, an account, verified by his oath, of all moneys received by him in his official capacity for the government of Guam during the preceding month;
