Committee on Rules, by request of the Governor in accordance with Section 6(b) of the Organic Act of Guam.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 4 OF PUBLIC LAW 8-102 RELATIVE TO REVERSION TO GOVERNMENT OF LOT NO. 5174-C, IPAO BEACH RECREATION PARK.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 4 of Public Law 8-102 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 4. That former portion of the Ipao Beach Recreation Park excluded from said park by Section 1 of this Act may be sold or exchanged for the construction of a hotel if but only if any deed transferring said portion or any part thereof shall provide that the beach area thereof shall be reserved for the use of the general public and that the transferred land shall revert to the government of Guam if: (1) a contract for construction of the hotel is not awarded within 180 days of the date of approval of this Act and a 100% performance bond is not furnished by the contractor within said period, which contract may not be terminated or materially altered without the consent of the Governor; (2) said hotel is not completed and in use by February 23, 1972, except that for causes beyond the control of the contractor and not in violation of the contract, the Governor may extend such completion date until such causes are overcome; and (3) no less than ten percent (10%) of the authorized capital stock of the corporation owning the land is not made available for sale to the residents of Guam at par value for a period of two years from the effective date of this Act, notice of the availability of which stock to be published no less

1 than three times during said two year period in a newspaper of general circulation in Guam." 2 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure. 3 1.1.1
