AN ACT TO ADD A NEW CHAPTER 9 TO TITLE  
XXIV, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, RELATIVE  
TO SCHOOL SAFETY PATROLS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. A new Chapter 9 is hereby added to Title XXIV,  
3 Government Code of Guam, to read as follows:

4 "CHAPTER 9

5 School Safety Patrol

6 Section 23555. Safety Patrol. The Director of the  
7 Department of Public Safety is hereby authorized to appoint  
8 crossing guards or a school safety patrol to direct traffic  
9 at school crossings by means of lawful orders, signs or  
10 semaphores. Such persons shall wear a distinctive garb or  
11 insignia indicating such appointment. No minor other than a  
12 member of the school safety patrol shall direct or attempt  
13 to direct traffic unless authorized to do so by a Police  
14 officer.

15 Section 23556. Enforcement. It shall be unlawful for  
16 any person driving or operating any vehicle to fail to stop  
17 not less than fifty (50) feet from the nearest side of a  
18 school pedestrian lane where any signal device, flagman or  
19 other person is stationed, giving warning that children are  
20 about to cross or are crossing the street; and it is further  
21 declared unlawful to proceed until such signal has stopped,  
22 raised or been removed, or the flagman or person stationed  
23 at such pedestrian lane has given a signal to go, or has left  
24 the locality. Any violation of this Section shall be a  
25 misdemeanor punished as provided by Section 23408 of this  
26 Title."

27 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
