AN ACT MAKING SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS
FOR THE OPERATION OF THE LEGISLATIVE, EXECUTIVE
AND JUDICIAL BRANCHES OF THE GOVERNMENT OF
GUAM FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1969
AND FOR THE OFFICE OF GUAM'S WASHINGTON
REPRESENTATIVE FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR ENDING
DECEMBER 31, 1969 AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

12 available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General
13 Fund the sum of Ninety-Three Thousand Nine Hundred Forty-Nine
14 (\$93,949) for the Office of Guam's Washington Representative
15 for the calendar year ending December 31, 1969.

16 Section 3. Section 2, of Public Law 9-236, Ninth Guam
17 Legislature, is hereby repealed in its entirety.

18 Section 4. The budget analysis of this Act (as amended
19 by the Legislature), prepared by the Committee on Finance and
20 Taxation of the Legislature, is attached to this Act and is
21 incorporated herein by reference as a recital preceding the
22 enactment clause for the purpose of assisting in the interpreta-
23 tion and implementation of this Act.

DIGEST ON BILL NO. 219(1-S)

I. For General Governmental Operations:

COURTS OF GUAM

The additional need for the courts of Guam is to implement P.L. 9-256, Ninth Guam Legislature. This embraces the increased salaries of the Island Court judges plus the anticipated appointment of two additional judges; additional printing and a \$25,000 request for jury fees.

GUAM LEGISLATURE

This is to supplement the appropriation made by P.L. 9-236 which appropriated for the operation of the Legislature only up to January 31, 1969. The \$75,000 item for the Committee Working Fund is for the use of Select and Standing Committees in the performance of their duties as set forth by the Standing Rules of the Legislature and/or as instructed by resolutions of this Legislature. \$25,000 of this amount is to contract for the recodification of our laws.

EXECUTIVE OFFICES:
Civil Service Commission

This is to supplement the previous appropriation of the commission to fund for the recruitment of additional personnel.

DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND TAXATION

The request is due to reclassification of positions effective January and the hiring of additional employees. This was brought about by the reorganization of the Executive Branch of the government resulting in the creation of the Department of Revenue and Taxation.

GROUP LIFE INSURANCE

This amount will be the initial contribution of the government of Guam to the employees' Group Life Insurance authorized by law.

COMMISSIONERS OF GUAM

The sum of \$16,800 is to finance for the forthcoming constitutional convention authorized by P.L. 9-244.

DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION

This is to finance new positions, reclassification and overall expenses resulting from the reorganization.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY

This is to cover overtime expenses incurred for security services rendered in connection with special events and to provide modest allowance for the same for the remainder of the year; to finance increment payment for personnel.

DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS

This is to finance the operation of the Director's Office of this new Department, for administrative services, clinical and rehabilitation services, reclassification and additional positions necessitated by the creation of this department.

CIVIL DEFENSE

To procure supplies for the fabrication of boxes for storage of emergency supplies in designated emergency centers.

INSURANCE AND SECURITIES

(Revenue and Taxation)

To recruit personnel necessary to implement the provisions of the Uniform Security Act and Consumer Credit Act.

SANITATION AND WASTER REMOVAL

(Garbage and Trash Collection - Public Works)

This will supplement the appropriation made by P.L. 9-236; requested amount to be earmarked for anticipated overtime.

FOR HOSPITAL

This will supplement the previous operational appropriation to recruit additional staff to man the 45 additional bed facilities, to provide for reclassifications, to replace 2 posting machines, to cover expenses for connection to watermain and the installation of water sprinklers.

FOR SOCIAL AND COMMUNITY SERVICES
(Economic Opportunity Commission)

The office of Economic Opportunity Commission starts its fiscal year on April. 1, thereby needing \$95,000 to operate until June 30, 1969. Supplemental appropriation will be included in the regular government of Guam fiscal year 1970 budget.

FOR PUBLIC ASSISTANCE

This will supplement previous appropriations for payments to Welfare clients caused by the increased number of recipients.

FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS:

\$50,000 recommended in this request is to provide money for payment to the Commercial Port of Guam mowing services for which was never provided for in the original budget.

UNIVERSITY OF GUAM

This is to supplement the previous appropriation of the University which will allow the University to contract for the completion of a feasibility study on the Multi-Media Program (Educational TV) and to subsidize the book store.

FOR RECREATION:
(Parks and Grounds)

This is to construct necessary facilities on the site of the nearly completed public swimming pool in Agana.

DEPARTMENT OF LABOR

This is to finance current operations beginning October and to provide for additional positions upon the effective date of this Act.

FOR UTILITIES AND OTHER PURPOSES:
(Airport Terminal)

This is to provide for additional general helpers for procurement of supplies and maintenance of music and air conditioning systems.

OFFICE OF GUAM'S WASHINGTON
REPRESENTATIVE

This is for the calendar year 1969 operational needs of Representative A. B. Won Pat. An appropriation of \$50,000 made by Section 2 of P.L. 9-236, Ninth Guam Legislature is reverted to the General Fund and the request shown in this bill is for the periods beginning January 1, 1969 through December 31, 1969. The sum of \$800 of this request is to reimburse Representative A. B. Won Pat for a judgement made against him due to a car

accident. Said car being owned by the Government of Guam, the Attorney General's Office have given an opinion stating that Representative Won Pat is entitled to said claim.
