AN ACT TO AMEND THE FIRST PARAGRAPH OF SECTION 23146 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO REQUIRE THAT A USED MOTOR VEHICLE MAY NOT BE SOLD WITHOUT A SAFETY INSPECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. The first paragraph of Section 23146 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 23146. Safety inspection required. (a) Every motor vehicle, trailer, semi-trailer, and pole or pipe dolly shall be inspected by the Department of Public Safety and an official certificate of safety inspection and approval obtained for each such vehicle as follows:

(1) Upon an original application for registration.
(2) Annually, at such time as designated by the
Director of Public Safety by rules and regulations.

(3) Following a collision or other accident in which such vehicle is involved, if extensive repairs are necessitated by such accident. The officer investigating motor vehicle accidents is authorized to remove the safety decalcomania from the vehicle or vehicles involved thereon if such officer believes the vehicle damage is extensive enough to require substantial repairs.

(4) Upon being offered for sale as a used vehicle intended to provide transportation. No used motor vehicle may be sold, except for parts or as scrap, until it shall have first been given the safety inspection required by this Section and its condition approved by the Department."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
