AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 25308, 25308.1, 25318, 25318.1, AND 25519 OF THE GOVERN-MENT CODE OF GUAM AND SECTION 397 OF THE PENAL CODE OF GUAM TO CHANGE THE LEGAL AGE FOR CONSUMING ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES FROM 20 to 19.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 25308 of the Government Code of Guam
is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 25308. Minors: employment forbidden. A licensee shall not employ any minor under the age of 19, in or about that portion of the premises which is used for the sale or service of alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises. Provided, however, that minors ages 16 and above may be employed as entertainers in on-sale premises under regulations made by the Board. Such regulations shall include, but are not limited to, provisions for registration of entertainers, hours of employment, conditions of employment and the responsibility of licensees employing such minors."

Section 2. Section 25308.1 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 25308.1. Same: entry forbidden. No person under nineteen years of age shall enter an establishment where alcoholic beverages except beer are consumed, unless such establishment is a public eating place as defined in Section 25018 of the Government Code of Guam. Every person who violates this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days or by both such fine and imprisonment."

Section 3. Section 25318 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 25318. Same: To Minor. A licensee, his agent or employee shall not sell, give nor permit to be sold, given or served any alcoholic beverages to any person under nineteen years of age. For the purpose of preventing any violation of this section, any licensee or his agent or employee may refuse to sell or serve alcoholic beverages to any person who is unable to produce adequate written evidence that he or she is over the age of nineteen years. In any criminal prosecution or proceeding for the suspension or revocation of any license and based upon a violation of this section, proof that the defendant licensee or his agent or employee demanded and was shown before furnishing any alcoholic beverage to a minor, an identification card or other bona fide documentary evidence of majority of such person shall be a defense to such prosecution or proceeding for the suspension or revocation of any license. Every person who violates this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days or by both such fine and imprisonment." Section 4. Section 25318.1 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 25318.1. Same: false identification by minor.

Any person, under nineteen years of age, who exhibits

a false identification card or false document for the

purpose of purchasing or obtaining alcoholic beverages

shall be punished by a fine of not more than five

hundred dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment not exceeding

six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment."

Section 5. Section 25519 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 25519. Same: minors. Any person under the age of nineteen years purchasing alcoholic beverages or in possession thereof shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) or by imprisonment not exceeding three (3) months or by both such fine and imprisonment."

Section 6. Section 397 of the Penal Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 397. Alcoholic Beverages, Selling of, to Minors. Every person who sells, gives, or delivers to any minor under the age of 19 years, any alcoholic beverage as defined in Section 25004, Title XXVI, Chapter 1, of the Government Code of Guam, in any quantity whatsoever, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than \$500 or by imprisonment for a period not exceeding 90 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment: Provided, that this section shall not apply to the parents of such children, or to guardians of their wards."

Section 7. This Act is an urgency measure.
