AN ACT TO REPEAL SUBSECTION (b) OF SECTION 9115, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, AND IN LIEU THEREOF TO ENACT A NEW SUBSECTION (b) AND TO AMEND SUBSECTION (c) OF SECTION 9115, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, RELATIVE TO CHILDREN ELIGIBLE FOR PUBLIC ASSISTANCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Subsection (b) of Section 9115, Government Code of Guam, is hereby repealed and, in lieu thereof, a new Subsection (b) is hereby enacted to read as follows:

"(b) Is under the age of eighteen (18) years, or under the age of twenty-one (21), and enrolled as a fulltime student and regularly attending a school, college, or university, or its equivalent; or regularly attending a course of vocational or technical training designed to fit him for gainful employment;"

Section 2. Subsection (c) of Section 9115, Government Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(c) Is deprived of parental support or suitable care by reason of the death, continued absence from home, physical or mental incapacity, or cruelty, neglect or depravity on the part of a parent, or by the unemployment of his father, the term 'unemployment' being defined by the Federal Social Security Act, as amended, (42 U.S.C. §607); and"

Section 3. This Act shall take effect July 1, 1969. Section 4. This Act is an urgency measure.
