AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 4024 OF THE
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO INCLUDE
AMONG THOSE PERSONNEL PERMITTED
SABBATICAL LEAVE CONSULTANTS AT THE
DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 4024 of the Government Code of Guam
3 is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 4024. Sabbatical Leave. All consultants,
5 teachers, vice principals, assistant principals, and
6 principals of the Department of Education, and instructors
7 of the College of Guam, who are permanent residents of
8 the territory of Guam, may be given a sabbatical leave of
9 absence upon completion of seven consecutive years of
10 satisfactory teaching service. To be eligible for such
11 sabbatical leave, an employee must have obtained a
12 baccalaureate degree or its equivalent, or be otherwise
13 deemed of sufficient skill and experience to deserve such
14 a leave. The Board of Education or the Board of Regents,
15 as the case may be, shall determine eligibility for such
16 leave and shall schedule the same in such way as not
17 to unduly interfere with or disrupt the operations of the
18 Department of Education or College of Guam, respectively.
19 As a condition for the granting of sabbatical leave, the
20 employee must, during the period of such leave, be engaged
21 in endeavors related to his field of employment, and agree
22 to return to his employment following such leave for a

1 period of not less than two (2) years. 'Sabbatical
2 leave' for the purpose of this section means twelve (12)
3 calendar months of fully paid leave, and any accumulated
4 regular annual leave must be included within and taken at
5 the same time as the sabbatical leave."

6 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
