AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR
NECESSARY CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AND
FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. The following sums are hereby appropriated
3 from any available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of
4 the General Fund for the following purposes:

DIGEST

I For General Government:

- A. Government Claims Fund: This is to supplement current appropriation providing for legitimate claims against the government of Guam. The unexpended balance of the original \$5,000 appropriation is \$42.00; outstanding claims against the Governor to date amounts to approximately \$22,000.
- B. Renovation of Red Cross Building: To renovate the former Red Cross Building in Agana to house the Civil Service Commission and the office of the Public Defender. The project included rehabilitation of interior walls, floor, windows and painting, as well as air conditioning.
- C. Congress Building Renovation and Improvement: The complete cost for renovation of the Guam Congress Building is estimated at \$350,000. The sum of \$25,000 is requested to be effective immediately and the balance is requested in Section 3 of this bill to be effective July 1, 1969. Plans and specifications have been completed and Drawings of the same have been made available to members of the Committee on Rules.

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3 II For Public Schools:

- 4 (A) Completion of Additional Trade and Technical
5 School Classrooms. This is to supplement prior
6 appropriation of \$54,000 to provide interior
7 partitions, ceiling, flooring, and chalkboards for
8 five classrooms at the Trade and Technical School.
9 The original appropriation of \$54,000 (local funding)
10 with a matching fund of \$54,000 (Federal funds)
11 was only able to construct the new addition to a shell
12 facility. The additional request will complete the
13 classrooms for full utilization.
- 14 (B) Repairs of School Roofs. This is to cover expenses
15 incurred for emergency repairs of roofs leaks at
16 various schools.
- 17 (C) John F. Kennedy High School Restoration. This bill
18 provide for the rehabilitation of approximately 1000
19 square feet of space damaged by the fire at the
20 high school.
- 21 (D) Contribution to the College Dormitory Construction Fund.
22 This is to supplement prior appropriation made by the
23 Ninth Guam Legislature in the amount of \$340,000 for
24 construction of the College Dormitory and Student
25 Union Building. The total sum of \$336,800 is needed to
26 complete the proposed project broken down into the
27 following: \$120,000 for the procurement of collateral
28 equipment; \$110,000 for utility connections; \$101,800
29 for the payment of the Architectural and Engineering
30 designs, and \$5,000 for contingency. The sum of
31 \$238,000 is necessary to be made available immediately
32 in order that the University may receive the second

1 increment of the Federal funding from the federal
2 government. The balance of the request is in Section 3
3 of this bill, which will give them authorization to
4 proceed in the ordering of equipments and in the
5 connection of utilities.

6 (E) Construction of Health Science Building. This is to
7 supplement prior appropriation of \$200,000 for the
8 construction of Health Science Building (Nursing) at
9 the University of Guam. The structure will have
10 offices for instructors, classrooms and other nurse
11 training facilities. Stringent fire safety and air
12 conditioning requirements resulting in the additional
13 cost to the building. The Tenth Guam Legislature
14 during the first portion of its first regular session
15 adopted a resolution authorizing the Governor to
16 sign a contract for the construction of this proposed
17 Health Science Building. Accordingly, the additional
18 request is necessary to supplement the original funding.

19 (F) Construction of Biological Station. This will supplement
20 an appropriation of \$150,000 made by the Ninth Guam
21 Legislature to construct said Biological Station.
22 A grant from the Department of Health Education and Welfare
23 of \$95,590.00 is available, however, the total con-
24 struction cost needed to complete said station is
25 \$295,590.00

26 (G) Inarajan Jr. High School. This will supplement
27 previous appropriation for plans and specifications
28 for the proposed \$2,000,000 Jr. High School in Inarajan
29 to be funded under the Rehabilitation Funds.

30 III For the Hospital

31 (A) Plans for hospital facilities. This is to determine
32 actual construction needs of the hospital, to correct
33 deficiencies cited by the accreditation team and to
34 meet the further needs of the territory.

1 (B) Completion of the F Wing (GWH). This will supplement
2 previous appropriation to complete the TB wing of the
3 hospital.

4 IV For Social and Community Services:

5 (A) Governor's Committee on Children and Youth: This will
6 supplement the current appropriation of \$110,000 to cover
7 anticipated difficiencies due to increased activities
8 of this committee.

9 (B) Economic Opportunity Commission: This will cover the
10 transportation expenses of 15 Job Corps trainees and one
11 chaperon to Hawaii and the anticipated travel of an
12 additional six trainees and one chaperon to Los Angeles,
13 California. Except for the transportation cost, other
14 expenses incurred by the trainees had been funded by
15 the federal government.

16 V For Public Library:

17 (A) Collateral Equipment for Barrigada Library: This is to
18 provide bookshelves, periodically racks, card catalogs files
19 reading room furnitures and others for the new branch
20 in Barrigada.

21 (B) Library Improvement: This is to provide for improvement
22 at the Central Library in Agana.

23 VI For Utilities and Other Enterprises:

24 (A) Utility System for Low-Rent Housing Area: The request
25 is to provide on site utilities for the 250 low rent
26 housing unit administered by the Guam Housing and Urban
27 Renewal Authority. Thirty Thousand (\$30,000) Dollars
28 is for the water distribution system and for fire
29 hydrants; \$152,000 is for electrical work; and \$40,000
30 for street and parking lighting system.

31 (B) Utility System and Street Paving for West Acre
32 Subdivision and other areas. This is to supplement
33 the allocation for the development of the west acre
34 subdivision to offset the oversizing of utility lines to

1 to accommodate other developments adjacent to this
2 tract. This subdivision will have graded lots, paved street
3 water, sewer and power.

4 (C) Telephone Expansion: This will supplement prior appro-
5 priation made by the Guam Legislature for the construction
6 of the Santa Rita and Tamuning telephone expansion and to
7 provide for the procurement of telephone cables. The
8 total sum of \$350,000 is needed, of which \$80,000 is
9 requested to be made available at this time; the
10 balance would be made available July 1, 1969.

11 Section 2. Appropriations made by this Act shall be effective
12 immediately, and shall be available for all expenses incident to the
13 purposes for which made. Every appropriation made herein shall continue
14 in full force and effect and shall be available until expended for the
15 project for which made or until the project is completed.

16 Section 4. The following sums are hereby appropriated from any
17 available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund for
18 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1969 for the following purposes:

19 I For General Government

20 (A) Congress Building Renovation. The sum of \$325,000 is
21 to supplement the \$25,000 requested on Section 1 of this
22 bill.

23 (B) Construction of public warehouse. This is to construct
24 an 80 feet by 200 feet warehouse at the Public Works
25 yard to provide space for furniture and appliance
26 storage, furniture repair shop, and construction activity
27 storage and repair shop. A portion of this warehouse
28 will also be used for testing activities. Presently,
29 there activities are housed at the old Public Works
30 Complex which now belongs to the GEDA. The Authority
31 has advised the Department of Public Works to vacate
32 the premises in order that development of this old
33 complex as an Industrial Center may proceed.

II For Public Schools:

- A. College Dormitory Construction Fund: This is to supplement the appropriation made on Section 1 of this bill. The appropriation of this amount will complete the funding for this project.

III For Utilities and Other Enterprises:

- A. Telephone Expansion: This will supplement the appropriation made on Section 1 of this bill and will complete the total request for the project.
- B. Utilities Expansion. This is for the expansion of utilities in various areas.

IV Community and Social Services:

- A. Economic Opportunity Commission: This is for the construction of a Model Head Start Building to be built in East Barrigada.

V For Protection and Development of Resources:

- A. Contribution to Farmers' Cooperative Association Revolving Loan Fund: The \$75,000 request is to augment the original \$75,000 appropriated to assist the Guam Farmers' Cooperative in furthering their cause in increasing agricultural productions for public marketing.

Section 3. This is to conform with the provision of the Law whereby the Legislature must annually audit or cause an audit of all accounts and transactions of the government of Guam.
