#### DIGEST

## I For General Government:

- A. Government Claims Fund: This is to supplement current appropriation providing for legitimate claims against the government of Guam. The unexpended balance of the original \$5,000 appropriation is \$42.00; outstanding claims against the Governor to date amounts to approximately \$22,000.
- B. Renovation of Red Cross Building: To renovate the former Red Cross Building in Agama to house the Civil Service Commission and the office of the Public Defender. The project included rehabilitation of interior walls, floor, windows and painting, as well as air conditioning.
- C. Congress Building Renovation and Improvement:

  The complete cost for renovation of the Guam

  Congress Building is estimated at \$350,000. The

  sum of \$25,000 is requested to be effective

  immediately and the balance is requested in

  Section 3 of this bill to be effective July 1, 1969.

  Plans and specifications have been completed and

  Drawings of the same have been made available to

  members of the Committee on Rules.

### II For Public Schools:

- (A) Completion of Additional Trade and Technical

  School Classrooms. This is to supplement prior appropriation of \$54,000 to provide interior partitions, ceiling, flooring, and chalkboards for five classrooms at the Trade and Technical School.

  The original appropriation of \$54,000 (local funding) with a matching fund of \$54,000 (Federal funds) was only able to construct the new addition to a shell facility. The additional request will complete the classrooms for full utilization.
- (B) Repairs of School Roofs. This is to cover expenses incurred for emergency repairs of roofs leaks at various schools.
  - (C) John F. Kennedy High School Restoration. This bill provide for the rehabilitation of approximately 1000 square feet of space damaged by the fire at the high school.
  - (D) Contribution to the College Dormitory Construction Fund. This is to supplement prior appropriation made by the Ninth Guam Legislature in the amount of \$340,000 for construction of the College Dormitory and Student Union Building. The total sum of \$336,800 is needed to complete the proposed project broken down into the following: \$120,000 for the procurement of collateral equipment; \$110,000 for utility connections; \$101,800 for the payment of the Architectural and Engineering designs, and \$5,000 for contingency. The sum of \$238,000 is necessary to be made available immediately in order that the University may receive the second

increment of the Federal funding from the federal government. The balance of the request is in Section 3 of this bill, which will give them authorization to proceed in the ordering of equipments and in the connection of utilities.

- (E) Construction of Health Science Building. This is to supplement prior appropriation of \$200,000 for the construction of Health Science Building (Nursing) at the University of Guam. The structure will have offices for instructors, classrooms and other nurse training facilities. Stringent fire safety and air conditioning requirements resulting in the additional cost to the building. The Tenth Guam Legislature during the first portion of its first regular session adopted a resolution authorizing the Governor to sign a contract for the construction of this proposed Health Science Building. Accordingly, the additional request is necessary to supplement the original funding.
- (F) Construction of Biological Station. This will supplement an appropriation of \$150,000 made by the Ninth Guam Legislature to construct said Biological Station.

  A grant from the Department of Health Education and Welfare of \$95,590.00 is available, however, the total construction cost needed to complete said station is \$295,590.00
- (G) Inarajan Jr. High School. This will supplement previous appropriation for plans and specifications for the proposed \$2,000,000 Jr. High School in Inarajan to be funded under the Rehabilitation Funds.

## III. For the Hospital

(A) Plans for hospital facilities. This is to determine actual construction needs of the hospital, to correct difficiencies cited by the accreditation team and to meet the further needs of the territory.

(B) Completion of the F Wing (GWH). This will supplement 1 previous appropriation to complete the TB wing of the 2 hospital. 3 For Social and Community Services: (A) Governor's Committee on Children and Youth: This will supplement the current appropriation of \$110,000 to cover anticipated difficiences due to increased activities of this committee. 8 (B) Economic Opportunity Commission: This will cover the 9 transportation expenses of 15 Job Corps trainees and one 10. chaperon to Hawaii and the anticipated travel of an 11 additional six trainees and one chaperon to Los Angeles, 12 California. Except for the transportation cost, other 13 expenses incurred by the trainees had been funded by 14 the federal government. 15 For Public Library: 16 (A) Collateral Equipment for Barrigada Library: This is to 17 provide bookshelves, periodically racks, card catalogs files 18 reading room furnitures and others for the new branch 19 in Barrigada. 20 21 (B) Library Improvement: This is to provide for improvement at the Central Library in Agana. 22 23 For Utilities and Other Enterprises: (A) Utility System for Low-Rent Housing Area: The request 24 is to provide on site utilities for the 250 low rent 25 ·housing unit administered by the Guam Housing and Urban 26 27 Renewal Authority. Thirty Thousand (\$30,000) Dollars 28 is for the water distribution system and for fire 29 hydrants; \$152,000 is for electrical work; and \$40,000 30 for street and parking lighting system. 31 (B) Utility System and Street Paving for West Acre Subdivision and other areas. This is to supplement 32 33 the allocation for the development of the west acre 34 subdivision to offset the oversizing of utility lines to -1-

to accommodate other developments adjacent to this 1 tract. This subdivision will have graded lots, paved street 2 water, sewer and power. 3 (C) Telephone Expansion: This will supplement prior appro-4 priation made by the Guam Legislature for the construction 5 of the Santa Rita and Tamuning telephone expansion and to 6 provide for the procurement of telephone cables. The 7 total sum of \$350,000 is needed of which \$80,000 is 8 requested to be made available at this time; the 9 balance would be made available July 1, 1969. 10 Section 2. Appropriations made by this Act shall be effective 11 immediately, and shall be available for all expenses incident to the 12 purposes for which made. Every appropriation made herein shall continue 13 in full force and effect and shall be available until expended for the 14 project for which made or until the project is completed. 15 Section 4. The following sums are hereby appropriated from any 16 available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund for 17 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1969 for the following purposes: 18 I For General Government 19. (A) Congress Building Renovation. The sum of \$325,000 is 20 to supplement the \$25,000 requested on Section 1 of this 21 bill. 22 (B) Construction of public warehouse. This is to construct 23 an 80 feet by 200 feet warehouse at the Public Works 24 yard to provide space for furniture and appliance 25 storage, furniture repair shop, and construction activity 26 storage and repair shop. A portion of this warehouse 27 will also be used for testing activities. Presently, 28 there activities are housed at the old Public Works 29 30 Complex which now belongs to the GEDA. The Authority has advised the Department of Public Works to vacate 31 the premises in order that development of this old 32 complex as an Industrial Center may proceed. 33

II For Public Schools:

A. College Dormitory Construction Fund: This is to supplement the appropriation made on Section 1 of this bill. The appropriation of this amount will complete the funding for this project.

III For Utilities and Other Enterprises:

- A. Telephone Expansion: This will supplement the appropriation made on Section 1 of this bill and will complete the total request for the project.
- B. Utilities Expansion. This is for the expansion of utilities in various areas.

IV Community and Social Services:

A. Economic Opportunity Commission: This is for the construction of a Model Head Start Building to be built in East Barrigada.

V For Protection and Development of Resources:

A. Contribution to Farmers' Cooperative

Association Revolving Loan Fund: The \$75,000 request
is to augment the original \$75,000 appropriated to
assist the Guam Farmers' Cooperative in furthering
their cause in increasing agricultural productions for
public marketing.

Section 3. This is to conform with the provision of the Law whereby the Legislature must annually audit or cause an audit of all accounts and transactions of the government of Guam.
