AN ACT TO ADD A NEW CHAPTER 10 TO TITLE XXIV,
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, RELATIVE TO SPEED OR
ACCELERATION CONTESTS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. A new Chapter 10 is hereby added to Title
3 XXIV, Government Code of Guam, to read as follows:

4 "CHAPTER 10

5 Speed or Acceleration Contests

6 Section 23560. Permit. Any person, group, club or
7 association desiring to engage in vehicle speed or
8 acceleration contests on public or private property shall
9 make application to the Director for a permit for any
10 such contest. The permit herein provided may contain, but,
11 should not be limited to, conditions as to the location
12 of such contests, safety regulations, supervision and
13 speed limitations.

14 Section 23561. Liability. Issuance of any permit
15 under the foregoing section shall not in any way cause
16 the government to be liable for accidents or injuries
17 occurring in any authorized speed or acceleration contest.

18 Section 23562. Prohibition. Any person engaging in a
19 speed or acceleration contest in violation of this chapter
20 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

21 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
