Committee on Rules, by request of the Governor in accordance with Section 6(b) of the Organic Act of Guam.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 9500.6, 9500.7 AND 9500.14 OF CHAPTER 6, TITLE X, GOVERN-MENT CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO THE PENALTY UNDER THE HEALTH AND SANITATION CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 9500.6 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 9500.6. Maintaining a Public Nuisance. Every person who maintains or commits any public nuisance, on either public or private property, or who willfully omits to perform any legal duty relating to the removal of a public nuisance, is punishable by imprisonment not exceeding two (2) months, or by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00), or both."

Section 2. Section 9500.7 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 9500.7. Public Nuisance on Private Property, Every person who maintains, permits or allows a public nuisance to exist upon his or her property or premises, and every person occupying or leasing the property or premises of another who maintains, permits or allows a public nuisance to exist thereon after ten (10) days! notice in writing from the Director or Attorney General to discontinue or abate the same has been personally served upon such person, is punishable by imprisonment not exceeding two (2) months, or by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00), or both. The existence of such nuisance for each and every day beyond the tenth day

after the service of such notice shall be deemed a 1 separate and distinct offense. It is the duty of the 2 Attorney General to prosecute all persons guilty of 3 violating this section by continuous prosecutions until 4 the nuisance is abated and removed." - 5 Section 3. Section 9500.14 of the Government Code of Guam 6 is hereby amended to read as follows: 7 "Section 9500.14. Penalty. Any person who violates 8 any provision of this Chapter, or any valid rule or 9 regulation promulgated under this Chapter, or who refuses 10 or neglects to comply with any lawful order issued by 11 the Director, the Health Officer, or other officers and 12 personnel of the Division of Public Health and Sanitation 13 in the carrying out of the provisions of this Chapter, 14 the penalty for which is not otherwise prescribed in this 15 Chapter is punishable by imprisonment not exceeding two (2) 16 months or by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars 17

(\$100.00), or both."

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
