21 Section 2. Statement of Legislative Intent. In appro-
22 priating funds for the operation of the Executive Branch for
23 only two (2) months, as set out in Section 1 of this Act, it
24 is the intent of the Legislature to provide the new adminis-
25 tration now taking office in the Executive Branch an oppor-
26 tunity, during said two-months' period, to review the bud-
27 get requests made by the outgoing administration and presented
28 to the Legislature in January of 1969 so that the new admi-
29 nistration can revise any request not in consonance with its
30 program, and so that it will not be committed to carry out
31 programs funded through June of 1970 which it had no part

1 in the planning. However, in order to preserve the status
2 quo pending the review by the new administration of its
3 budgetary requirements and its submission thereof to the
4 Legislature, no new positions shall be created nor new execu-
5 tive programs initiated by the new administration during the
6 two-month period provided for in this Act, the period being
7 designed to permit a review by the new administration of
8 current programs of the government and an opportunity to
9 prepare its own plans and programs for submission to the
10 Legislature for funding.
