Introduced by Committee on Rules, by request of the Governor in accordance with Section 6(b) of the Organic Act of Guam.

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW CHAPTER 13 TO TITLE XIV, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, RELATIVE TO THE GUAM HISTORIC SITE COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
Section 1. A new Chapter 13 is hereby added to Title
XIV, Government Code of Guam, to read as follows:

"CHAPTER 13

GUAM HISTORIC SITE COMMISSION

Section 13985. Definitions:

- (a) Commission means the Guam Historic Site Commission.
- (b) A 'historic site' is a structure or place within Guam of outstanding historical and cultural significance and designated as such by the Commission.
- (c) A 'historic area' is a district or zone within which the buildings, structures, appurtenances and places are of basic and vital importance for the development of culture and tourism because of their association with history; because of their unique architectural style and scale, including color, proportions, form and architectural details; or because of their being a part of or related to a square, park or area, the design or general arrangement of which should be preserved and/or developed according to a fixed plan based on cultural, historical or architectural motives or purposes and which has been so designated by the Commission.
- (d) 'Executive Director' means the Director of the Department of Land Management.

Section 13985.1. Guam Historic Site Commission: (a) The Guam Historic Site Commission shall consist 2 of the members of the Territorial Planning Commission. 3 Section 13985.2. Powers of the Commission. The 4 Commission shall be authorized to: 5 (a) Designate historic sites and areas on the basis of the following criteria: Historical and 8 cultural significance: suitability for preservation; educational value; cost of acquisition, restoration, 9 maintenance and repair; appraised value; and adminis-10 trative responsibility of a sponsoring group or 11 individual: 12 (b) Prepare regulations amplifying the foregoing 13 criteria and clarifying the methods by which it shall 14 exercise the powers conferred herein; 15 (c) When the public interest in its preservation 16 requires such action, acquire by gift, purchase or 17 condemnation, where exceptional circumstances require 18 it, pursuant to the provisions of Title V of Part III 19 of the Code of Civil Procedure of Guam, any designated 20 21 historic site or area as defined herein, or any interest therain sufficient to mucromer its bistorie staristic; (d) Make appropriate provision for the restoration, 23 preservation and operation of such sites and areas as 24 25 may be acquired; (e) Inspect all designated sites and areas at 26 periodic intervals not exceeding one (1) year to assure 27 their proper maintenance and preservation, and to specify 28 and require such repairs and maintenance as may be 29 found necessary upon inspection; 30 (f) Revoke the designation of any historic site or 31 area whose owner or owners fail or refuse to undertake 32 necessary repairs and maintenance. 33 - 2 -

and maintain public interest in historic sites and areas.

Section 13985.3. Commission Staff Personnel. The

Chief Executive Officer of the Commission shall be its

Executive Director who shall perform such services and exercise such powers as may be prescribed by the Commission. He may, by resolution, be appointed to serve as Secretary-Treasurer of the Commission. The Commission may, by resolution, authorize the employment of such expert consultants and clerical assistance as its work requires."
