



Bill No. 282

Introduced by R. J. Bordallo

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 6110 OF THE  
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO EXTEND THE  
SURPLUS PROPERTY LAW OF THE EXECUTIVE  
BRANCH OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM TO THE  
LEGISLATIVE AND JUDICIAL BRANCHES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 6110 of the Government Code of Guam  
3 is amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 6110. Property Survey. When property,  
5 (including property used or under the control of any of  
6 the three branches of the government of Guam, executive,  
7 legislative, or judicial,) has become unserviceable  
8 through wear and tear or otherwise, the same will be  
9 submitted for the action of the board of survey, appointed  
10 by the Governor, after lists have been prepared in  
11 triplicate by the responsible officer or agent. The  
12 report of the board of survey, when approved shall be  
13 filed as a voucher with the property return of the  
14 accountable officer. If the report shows the property  
15 to have become unserviceable and surplus to the needs of  
16 the government, then the property may be sold to the  
17 highest bidder. If such property cannot be sold, then  
18 it may be donated to local charitable, social or civic  
19 associations. The Director of Administration shall make  
20 rules and regulations, to be effective upon approval by  
21 the Governor and promulgation by Executive Order, to  
22 carry out the provisions of this section, the purpose of  
23 which is declared to be to provide for the orderly dis-  
24 position of no longer serviceable government property.

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Violation of this section or the rules and regulations promulgated hereunder shall constitute a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500 or by imprisonment not to exceed six months."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
