Introduced by R. F. Taitano

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 15210 OF THE
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO CHANGE THE DATE
OF THE DISSOLUTION OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL
CONVENTION TO CONFORM TO THE DATE ITS REPORT
IS DUE.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 15210 of the Government Code of Guam
3 is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 15210. Duties and Powers of the Convention.
5 The Constitutional Convention shall review in detail
6 the provisions of the Organic Act of Guam and shall
7 prepare a written report of its studies to be completed
8 and published not later than June 1, 1970. Such report
9 shall contain not only a comprehensive review of the
10 current provisions of the Organic Act but also recommen-
11 dations adopted by the Convention as to changes in said
12 Act. Such report shall be submitted to the Legislature,
13 to the Governor, to the President of the Senate of the
14 United States, and to the Speaker of the House of
15 Representatives of the United States. The Convention
16 shall have the power to employ its own staff outside
17 of the merit system of the government of Guam and to
18 engage consultants to assist its studies and the pre-
19 paration of its report. In carrying out its duties and
20 in preparing its report, the Convention shall cause
21 hearings to be held in each of the municipalities of
22 Guam at which time residents of such districts shall
23 be invited to make their views known to representatives
24 of the Convention on the Organic Act of Guam and any
25 proposed revisions thereto. (In connection with its

1 studies, the Convention, or any of its duly constituted
2 committees, shall have the power to compel the attendance
3 and testimony of witnesses (excluding members of the
4 Legislature, the Governor of Guam, and the Judges of the
5 Courts of Guam) at its or their proceedings and to
6 administer oaths to such witnesses, such power to be
7 enforced by application to the Island Court of Guam as
8 necessary.) The report of the Convention shall contain a
9 resume of the results of all such hearings. The
10 Convention shall dissolve as of the date the report is
11 submitted but in no event later than June 1, 1970."
12 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
