AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 15210 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO CHANGE THE DATE OF THE DISSOLUTION OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION TO CONFORM TO THE DATE ITS REPORT IS DUE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 15210 of the Government Code of Guam
is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 15210. Duties and Powers of the Convention. The Constitutional Convention shall review in detail the provisions of the Organic Act of Guam and shall prepare a written report of its studies to be completed and published not later than June 1, 1970. Such report shall contain not only a comprehensive review of the current provisions of the Organic Act but also recommendations adopted by the Convention as to changes in said Act. Such report shall be submitted to the Legislature, to the Governor, to the President of the Senate of the United States, and to the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the United States. The Convention shall have the power to employ its own staff outside of the merit system of the government of Guam and to engage consultants to assist its studies and the preparation of its report. In carrying out its duties and in preparing its report, the Convention shall cause hearings to be held in each of the municipalities of Guam at which time residents of such districts shall be invited to make their views known to representatives of the Convention on the Organic Act of Guam and any proposed revisions thereto. (In connection with its

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studies, the Convention, or any of its duly constituted committees, shall have the power to compel the attendance and testimony of witnesses (excluding members of the Legislature, the Governor of Guam, and the Judges of the Courts of Guam) at its or their proceedings and to administer oaths to such witnesses, such power to be enforced by application to the Island Court of Guam as necessary.) The report of the Convention shall contain a resume of the results of all such hearings. The Convention shall dissolve as of the date the report is submitted but in no event later than June 1, 1970."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
