Introduced by

Committee on Rules, by request of the Governor in accordance with Section 6(b) of the Organic Act of Guam.

AN ACT TO REPEAL SECTIONS 11701, 11702, 11703 AND TO ENACT NEW SECTIONS 11701, 11702, 11703, ALL OF CHAPTER 8, TITLE XII, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, RELATIVE TO TECHNICAL AMENDMENTS OF THE VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION LAW.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 11701 of Chapter 8, Title XII,
Government Code of Guam, is hereby repealed and a new Section
11701, Chapter 8, Title XII, Government Code of Guam, enacted
in lieu thereof to read as follows:

"Section 11701. Definitions. For the purpose of this Chapter:

- (a) 'Handicapped individual' means any individual who has a physical or mental disability and a substantial handicap to employment, which is of such a nature that vocational rehabilitation services may reasonably be expected to render him fit to engage in a gainful occupation, including a gainful occupation which is more consistent with his capabilities and abilities.
- (b) 'Individual who has a physical or mental disability' means a physical or mental condition which materially limits, contributes to limiting or, if not corrected, will probably result in limiting an individual's activities or functioning. It includes behavioral disorders characterized by a pattern of deviant social behavior or impaired

ability to carry out normal relationships with family and community which may result from vocational, educational, cultural, social, environmental, or other factors.

- (c) 'Gainful occupation' includes employment in the competitive labor market; practice of a profession; self-employment homemaking; farm or family work (including work for which payment is in kind rather than cash); sheltered employment; and home industries or other gainful homebound work.
- (d) 'Vocational rehabilitation service' means any goods and services, including diagnostic and related services, necessary to render a handicapped individual fit to engage in a gainful occupation.
- manufacture or handiwork is carried on, and which is operated for the primary purpose of providing gainful employment to severely handicapped individuals (1) as an interim step in the rehabilitation process for those who cannot be readily absorbed in the competitive labor market or (2) during such time as employment opportunities for them in the competitive labor market do not exist or (3) providing evaluation and work adjustment services for disadvantaged individuals.
- (f) 'Rehabilitation facilities' means a facility which is operated for the primary purpose of providing vocational rehabilitation services to or gainful employment for handicapped individuals, or for providing evaluation and work adjustment services for disadvantaged individuals.

- (g) 'Board' means the Board of Education, acting as the Board of Control for Vocational Rehabilitation.
- (h) 'State' means the several states, territories and possessions of the United States."

Section 2. Section 11702 of Chapter 8, Title XII,
Government Code of Guam, is hereby repealed and a new Section
11702, Chapter 8, Title XII, Government Code of Guam, enacted
in lieu thereof to read as follows:

"Section 11702, Administration. The Board of
Education shall act as the Board of Control for Vocational
Rehabilitation and shall administer this Chapter through
the Department of Education. The Director of Education
shall serve as Executive Officer of the Board. The Board
shall maintain a Vocational Rehabilitation Unit at such
an organizational level which assures that it will be
effective in the day to day operation of the Vocational
Rehabilitation Program. The Board shall select such
personnel and fix their duties under and in accordance
with Title V, Government Code of Guam, as may be necessary
for the purposes of this Chapter."

Section 3. Section 11703 of Chapter 8, Title XII,
Government Code of Guam, is hereby repealed and a new Section
11703, Chapter 8, Title XII, Government Code of Guam, enacted
in lieu thereof to read as follows:

"Section 11703. Provision of Services.

(a) Vocational Rehabilitation services shall be provided by the state agency or through public or private instrumentalities, to any handicapped individual living in the state who is found eligible by the state agency, or who is eligible therefor under the term of an agreement with another state or with the Federal government. Vocational Rehabilitation services shall be provided without

regards to sex, race, creed, color, national origin, residence, economic need, and no upper or lower age limit will be established which will, in and of itself result in a finding of ineligibility to receive services.

(b) In case vocational rehabilitation services cannot be provided for all eligible handicapped individuals who apply for such services, the Board shall provide by regulation for determining the order to be followed in selecting those to whom such services will be provided."

Section 4. This Act is an urgency measure.
