

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 9660.6 OF THE  
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATING TO  
THE PROHIBITION OF DUMPING RUBBISH IN  
RIVERS AND STREAMS, AND INCREASING THE  
PENALTY THEREFOR.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 9660.6 of the Government Code of  
3 Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 9660.6. Disposition. No person shall  
5 dispose of any garbage, rubbish, or other offensive  
6 substances, including dead animals and offal, into  
7 any river, creek, pond, reservoir, stream, well, or  
8 spring or any collection of fresh water, including,  
9 without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the  
10 Agana Swamp, into or upon any public or private driveway,  
11 alley, street, highway or road, beach, or any public  
12 place, or any other public property except in an  
13 authorized public dump or receptacle furnished for such  
14 purpose, or other place as may be authorized by the  
15 Director, or on any other private property except with the  
16 consent of the owner and in conformity with law. Any  
17 person who violates any of the provision of this Section  
18 is punishable by imprisonment not exceeding six months  
19 or by a fine not exceeding \$200, or both."

20 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
