"CHAPTER 4

Guam International Air Terminal

Section 47250. Guam International Air Terminal. Responsibility for all operations related to and connected with the Guam International Air Terminal is hereby delegated to the Director of the Department of Commerce, who shall be responsible for and have the power to:

(a) Establish rules for the operation of aircraft and other vehicles and equipment within...the terminal area.

(b) Enter into contracts as hereinafter provided for the use of government land, buildings, structures and other terminal facilities on such terms and conditions as he shall determine to be reasonable and proper.

(c) Establish, revise and collect uniform and reasonable rates, fees, rentals and other charges for use of terminal space and facilities.

(d) Pledge rental and other terminal receipts as collateral for the purpose of borrowing funds necessary to construct, improve or modify buildings, structures and facilities to be used in connection with terminal operations; and to further secure such borrowed funds by mortgaging real property, including improvements thereon upon which the air terminal is located. The power to pledge receipts given by this subsection does not include the power to issue revenue bonds.

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(e) Enter into contracts for the construction, extension, modification and maintenance of terminal buildings, structures, facilities and property, in accordance with plans and specifications prepared by the Department of Public Works.

(f) Establish, revise and collect fees and charges with respect to incoming passengers, landing fees, and fees for the use of facilities incident to the servicing of aircraft.

(g) Establish, revise and collect fees and charges for auto parking, taxicab parking and other public charges.

(h) Supervise all care, maintenance and security activities in accordance with such instructions relative thereto as have been issued by the air terminal's engineers.

Section 47251. Operation Fund. There is hereby established a fund to be known as the 'Guam International Air Terminal Fund,' which shall be maintained separate and apart from any other funds of the government of Guam, and independent records and accounts shall be maintained in connection therewith in a manner prescribed by the Director of Administration.

Section 47252. Receipts and Expenditures. All monies received by the Guam International Air Terminal from whatever source derived shall be deposited in said Guam International Air Terminal Fund. All debts,

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liabilities and obligations, capital expenditures and operating expenses of the said Guam International Air Terminal shall be paid from said fund, and the Director of Commerce is authorized to make the necessary disbursements. Quarterly reports of all receipts and disbursements from such fund shall be prepared by the Director and transmitted to the Legislature.

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Section 47253. Certain Contracts Subject to Approval. Contracts entered into by the Director of Commerce relative to construction, modification, leasing and mortgaging of facilities shall be subject to written approval by the Governor and the written concurrence of the Committee on Rules of the Legislature. No contracts to pledge any income of the Guam International Air Terminal as collateral for the borrowing of funds with which to construct, add to, improve or modify air terminal facilities shall be made without the express written approval of the Governor, (and written concurrence of the Legislature.")
