Committee on Rules, by request of the Governor in accordance with Section 6 (b) of the Organic Act of Guam.

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW CHAPTER 4 TO TITLE XLIV, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, RELATIVE TO THE GUAM INTERNATIONAL AIR TERMINAL.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. A new Chapter 4 is hereby added to Title  
3 XLIV, Government Code of Guam, to read as follows:

4 "CHAPTER 4

5 Guam International Air Terminal

6 Section 47250. Guam International Air Terminal.

7 Responsibility for all operations related to and connected  
8 with the Guam International Air Terminal is hereby  
9 delegated to the Director of the Department of Commerce,  
10 who shall be responsible for and have the power to:

11 (a) Establish rules for the operation of  
12 aircraft and other vehicles and equipment within  
13 the terminal area.

14 (b) Enter into contracts as hereinafter provided for the use of government land, buildings, structures and other terminal facilities on such terms and conditions as he shall determine to be reasonable and proper.

15 (c) Establish, revise and collect uniform and reasonable rates, fees, rentals and other charges for use of terminal space and facilities.

16 (d) Pledge rental and other terminal receipts as collateral for the purpose of borrowing funds necessary to construct, improve or modify buildings, structures and facilities to be used in connection with terminal operations; and to further secure

1 such borrowed funds by mortgaging real property,  
2 including improvements thereon upon which the air  
3 terminal is located. The power to pledge receipts  
4 given by this subsection does not include the power  
5 to issue revenue bonds.

6 (e) Enter into contracts for the construction,  
7 extension, modification and maintenance of terminal  
8 buildings, structures, facilities and property,  
9 in accordance with plans and specifications prepared  
10 by the Department of Public Works.

11 (f) Establish, revise and collect fees and  
12 charges with respect to incoming passengers, landing  
13 fees, and fees for the use of facilities incident  
14 to the servicing of aircraft.

15 (g) Establish, revise and collect fees and  
16 charges for auto parking, taxicab parking and other  
17 public charges.

18 (h) Supervise all care, maintenance and  
19 security activities in accordance with such ins-  
20 tructions relative thereto as have been issued by  
21 the air terminal's engineers.

22 Section 47251. Operation Fund. There is hereby  
23 established a fund to be known as the 'Guam International  
24 Air Terminal Fund,' which shall be maintained separate  
25 and apart from any other funds of the government of Guam,  
26 and independent records and accounts shall be maintained  
27 in connection therewith in a manner prescribed by the  
28 Director of Administration.

29 Section 47252. Receipts and Expenditures. All  
30 monies received by the Guam International Air Terminal  
31 from whatever source derived shall be deposited in said  
32 Guam International Air Terminal Fund. All debts,

1 liabilities and obligations, capital expenditures and  
2 operating expenses of the said Guam International  
3 Air Terminal shall be paid from said fund, and the  
4 Director of Commerce is authorized to make the necessary  
5 disbursements. (Quarterly reports of all receipts and  
6 disbursements from such fund shall be prepared by the  
7 Director and transmitted to the Legislature.)

8           Section 47253. Certain Contracts Subject to  
9 Approval. Contracts entered into by the Director of  
10 Commerce relative to construction, modification, leas-  
11 ing and mortgaging of facilities shall be subject to  
12 written approval by the Governor (and the written con-  
13 currence of the Committee on Rules of the Legislature.)  
14 No contracts to pledge any income of the Guam Interna-  
15 tional Air Terminal as collateral for the borrowing  
16 of funds with which to construct, add to, improve or  
17 modify air terminal facilities shall be made without  
18 the express written approval of the Governor, (and  
19 written concurrence of the Legislature.)"
