AN ACT TO ADD SECTION 588.1 TO THE PENAL CODE OF GUAM TO PROHIBIT THE DAMAGE TO PUBLIC HIGHWAYS BY HEAVY EQUIPMENT, AND TO REQUIRE THE REPAIR OF DAMAGE BY THOSE CAUSING THE SAME.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 588.1 is hereby added to the

Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"Section 588.1. Damaging highway by heavy vehicle. Every person who negligently or wilfully damages any public highway in the course of moving equipment or vehicles along a highway or in the course of construction projects near or adjacent to a highway shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by imprisonment not exceeding six months or by fine not exceeding \$500, or both. The provisions of this Section shall apply both to the operator of the equipment causing the damage and to the owner thereof. In addition to the criminal penalty set out herein, every person who owns the equipment responsible for the damage to the highway shall be required to repair such damage within 15 days after apprehension, or, in the event, he is unable to undertake such repair to repay to the government of Guam the cost thereof within ten days after such costs are determined by the Department of Public Works and demand is made for payment. Failure to so undertake such repair or pay the costs thereof shall constitute a misdemeanor, punishable by imprisonment notitoe exceed six months, or by fine not to exceed \$500, or, by both. Nothing herein contained shall be

construed as prohibiting the Department of Public Works
from undertaking emergency repair of a public highway
at any time."
