AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR NECESSARY CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. The following sums are hereby appropriated

from any available balance in the Unappropriated Surplus of
the General Fund for capital improvements and other purposes
indicated opposite the amounts.

Abandoned Vehicle Fund established by Public Law 9-42, effective immediately, the sum of \$50,000 for the purpose of removing all abandoned vehicles found on public and private properties on Guam, which abandoned vehicles shall be disposed of by sinking them in the reef waters of the territory to be used in improving the fisheries of Guam.
