AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 2 OF FUBLIC LAW 10-36, TENTH GUAM LEGISLATURE, TO CLARIFY THE RETIREMENT PRIVILEGES OF THOSE THE PORARY GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES MADE PERMANENT ON JULY 1, 1964 AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 2 of Public Law 10-36, Tenth Guam Legislature, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 2. The employment status of those temporary employees of the Public Utility Agency of Guam, and of the Department of Public Works, the latter commonly referred to as the 'Construction Battalion', shall be converted as of the effective date of this Act from 'temporary' to 'permanent'; subject to the following conditions:

- (a) Initial appointment shall be probationary, in accord with the Personnel Rules and Regulations;
- (b) Such employees shall retain their current class titles, subject to classification study, following which compensation shall be adjusted to the first step of the pay range of the position determined by such study;
- (c) For purposes of calculating leave and retirement benefits, such employees, including those age sixty or over on July 1, 1964, shall be credited with their temporary service prior to July 1, 1964, except that to obtain such retirement credit, such employees must pay into the fund or enter into binding agreements to so pay, the amount of contributions they would have made to the fund had they been permanent employees at the time of their temporary service. No such employee may be denied membership in the retirement fund solely because he was over the age of 60 years on July 1, 1964. The amount of contributions to be paid into the fund shall be paid in a lump sum or in installments under rules prescribed by the Board of Trustees of the

fund. The amount of contributions to be paid into the fund by the government of Guam shall be determined by applying the applicable percentage rate to the total wages paid to such employees."

Section 3. This Act is an urgency measure.
