

Bill No. 463

Introduced by J. T. Sablan

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 4003 OF THE
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO INCREASE
THE PREFERENTIAL GRANT GIVEN DISABLED
VETERANS ON COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION
SCORES IN GOVERNMENT SERVICE, AND TO
MAKE A TECHNICAL AMENDMENT TO SAID
SECTION.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 4003 of the Government Code of Guam is
3 hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 4003. Preference. No preference shall be
5 given in the government service, except that residents
6 of Guam who are veterans of the Armed Forces of the
7 United States, or members of the Guam Police Combat Patrol,
8 as certified by the Director of Public Safety, shall
9 receive a preferential credit of five points which shall
10 be added to their competitive examination score, and such
11 veterans or former members who are disabled as a result of
12 their service in the Armed Forces or the Combat Patrol,
13 shall receive a preferential credit of ten points which
14 shall be added to their competitive examination score.

15 In addition, if two applicants for government service are
16 equally qualified for the position to be filled, and one
17 is a resident veteran or member of the Guam Police Combat
18 Patrol, while the other applicant is not, the applicant
19 veteran or Combat Patrol member shall be given preference."

20 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
