
CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 4302.(d), CHAPTER
4, TITLE V, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM,
RELATIVE TO LEASING OF GOVERNMENT HOUSING.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 4302.(d) of Chapter 4, Title V,
3 Government Code of Guam, is amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 4302.(d). No expenditure may be made from
5 this fund to provide rental housing for any person, other
6 than the Governor of Guam, whose salary is not paid out
7 of funds appropriated by the Legislature, it being the
8 intention of this paragraph to prohibit the use of local
9 funds to provide housing for those paid from Federal or
10 other nonlocally appropriated funds, with the sole exception
11 of the Governor of Guam. Provided, however, that upon
12 approval of the Housing Board, housing temporarily surplus
13 to government requirements may be leased on a month-to-month
14 basis to non-government of Guam employees at the rate of
15 rent charged the government in the case of privately-owned
16 housing and in the case of government-owned housing, fair
17 market value."

18 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
