


CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW CHAPTER 4 TO TITLE
XLIV, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, RELATIVE
TO PLACING THE AGANA BOAT BASIN UNDER
THE JURISDICTION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF
COMMERCE.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. There is hereby added a new Chapter 4 to Title
3 XLIV, Government Code of Guam, to read as follows:

4 "Chapter 4

5 Agana Boat Basin

6 Section 47250. Administration. The Agana Boat Basin
7 as described in Section 3. of Public Law 86-664, 86th
8 Congress of the United States, is hereby placed under the
9 jurisdiction and control of the Department of Commerce.
10 The Agana Boat Basin shall be used solely for civic, park
11 and recreational purposes.

12 Section 47251. Master Plan. The Director of Commerce
13 shall prepare a master plan for proper development of the
14 facilities of the Agana Boat Basin and shall file the same
15 with the Governor and the Legislature. Such plan will in-
16 clude reasonable accurate estimates of the cost involved
17 and recommendations for incremental improvements.

18 Section 47252. Rules and Regulations. The Director
19 of Commerce shall make such rules and regulations as may
20 be necessary to carry out the purposes of this Chapter
21 which shall be approved and promulgated by Executive Order.

1 They shall include, but shall not be limited to, reasonable
2 fees for the use of moorings or berths, prohibitions
3 against habitation of boats within the Agana Boat Basin and
4 procedures for the removal of sunken hulks and the pre-
5 vention of nuisances.

6 Section 47253. Violation: Penalty. Every person who
7 violates, causes or permits to be violated, or fails or
8 refuses to comply with any rule or regulation adopted
9 pursuant to this Chapter, is guilty of a misdemeanor,
10 punishable by a fine of not more more than \$1,000, or by
11 imprisonment of not more than one year, or by both such
12 fine and imprisonment."

13 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.

- P.L. 10-152 "An Act to amend Section 15210 of the Government Code of Guam to extend the date of dissolution of the Constitutional Convention and the date its report is due; to amend Section 2 of Public Law 9-244 to increase the authorized appropriation for the operation of the Constitutional Convention and to supplement the appropriation made therefor by Public Law 10-60"

- P.L. 10-156 "An Act to amend Section 17650 of the Government Code of Guam to reduce the filing fee for applications for changes of zone from \$50.00 to \$10.00"
