AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 2931 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO AUTHORIZE ABSENTEE VOTING IN PRIMARY ELECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 2931 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

> "Section 2931. Manner of voting. Any person desiring to vote at a primary shall state his name and residence to the election officials. If the person desiring to vote is not challenged, one of the officials shall give to him one and only one official primary ballot. The voter shall proceed to one of the compartments provided and therein mark the ballot. The marked ballot shall immediately be placed in the ballot box provided. In addition, the provisions of Chapter 10 of this Title (Absent Voting) shall also apply to a primary election so as to permit voting by absentee ballot therein." Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
