AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 2050 OF CHAPTER 2,  
TITLE III, COMPOSITION OF THE ELECTION  
COMMISSION.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 2050 of Chapter 2, Title III, Govern-  
3 ment Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 2050. Election Commission. Composition:  
5 Chairman. There is within the government of Guam the  
6 Election Commission. The Commission shall consist of  
7 seven members, one of whom, the Chief Commissioner of  
8 Guam, which shall be the chairman, and the other six  
9 members shall be appointed by the Governor by and with  
10 the consent of the Legislature. No more than three of  
11 such members shall be members of the same recognized  
12 political party, and all of whom shall be eligible  
13 voters on the date of their appointment. The  
14 appointed members shall serve for a term of four years.  
15 Every member of the Commission who is not in the  
16 service of the government, for which he receives an  
17 annual compensation, shall be paid Ten Dollars (\$10.00)  
18 for each attendance of a meeting upon his duties.

19 Should at any time the Chief Commissioner of Guam  
20 be or become a candidate or nominee for an elective  
21 public office, or an official of a political party or  
22 for any other good and sufficient reason be determined  
23 by the Governor to be disqualified as chairman of the  
24 Commission, the Governor of Guam shall then appoint  
25 some other qualified person to serve as the

1 chairman of the Commission; provided, no one may  
2 be appointed chairman of the Commission who is not  
3 a United States citizen, at least 35 years of age  
4 and who has not resided in Guam for a period of  
5 five years prior to the date of appointment.

6 Any appointee to the position of Commission  
7 Chairman, except the Chief Commissioner of Guam,  
8 and any other government of Guam employee, shall  
9 receive a salary to be determined in accordance  
10 with the laws of Guam."

11 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
