AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 2050 OF CHAPTER 2, TITLE III, COMPOSITION OF THE ELECTION COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 2050 of Chapter 2, Title III, Government Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 2050. Election Commission. Composition: There is within the government of Guam the Chairman. Election Commission. The Commission shall consist of seven members, one of whom, the Chief Commissioner of Guam, which shall be the chairman, and the other six members shall be appointed by the Governor by and with the consent of the Legislature. No more than three of such members shall be members of the same recognized political party, and all of whom shall be eligible voters on the date of their appointment. The appointed members shall serve for a term of four years. Every member of the Commission who is not in the service of the government, for which he receives an annual compensation, shall be paid Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each attendance of a meeting upon his duties.

Should at any time the Chief Commissioner of Guam be or become a candidate or nominee for an elective public office, or an official of a political party or for any other good and sufficient reason be determined by the Governor to be disqualified as chairman of the Commission, the Governor of Guam shall then appoint some other qualified person to serve as the chairman of the Commission; provided, no one may be appointed chairman of the Commission who is not a United States citizen, at least 35 years of age and who has not resided in Guam for a period of five years prior to the date of appointment.

Any appointee to the position of Commission Chairman, except the Chief Commissioner of Guam, and any other government of Guam employee, shall receive a salary to be determined in accordance with the laws of Guam."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
