




Introduced by W. D. L. Flores

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 46004 OF THE
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO INCREASE THE
MINIMUM WAGE TO \$2.05 PER HOUR AND FOR
OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 46004 of the Government Code of Guam
3 is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 46004. Minimum Wages. Every employer shall
5 pay to each employee employed by him wages at not less
6 than the following rates:

- 7 1. For the period ending July 1, 1971, \$1.75
8 per hour;
9 2. For the period ending July 1, 1972, \$1.90
10 per hour;
11 3. Thereafter, \$2.05 per hour."

12 Section 2. In implementing the recommendations of the
13 Kamau Report, no position within the government of Guam, except
14 for student trainees, shall have a minimum rate of less than
15 \$2.00 per hour and no employee whose position is proposed to be
16 reduced in pay range shall have his salary reduced for a period
17 of one year.
