AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 20002(c) OF CHAPTER I, TITLE XXI, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, RELATIVE TO INTEREST RATE OF GUAM HOUSING CORPORATION LOANS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 20002(c) of Chapter I, Title XXI,

Government Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(c) To encourage and engage in low-cost housing activities, including development of residential subdivisions, construction of housing for rental or resale, and to make loans to any person for the purchase, construction, improvement or repair of a home. All loans so made shall be of such sound value or so secured as reasonably to assure repayment, taking into consideration the policy of the Legislature that the lending powers of the Housing Corporation shall be administered as a means for accomplishing the purposes stated in Section 20000 of this Chapter, and shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding one per centum per annum less than the Federal Housing Administration rate. First priority in making loans for the purchase or construction of homes shall be given to resident veterans of the Armed Forces of the United States who served in either the Vietnam Conflict, World War II or the Korean Conflict and were discharged from their respective branches of the service under conditions other than dishonorable, to enable them to purchase or construct permanent homes which are typhoon resistant, such loans not to exceed \$16,000 and to include therein both the cost of the land and of the building, and if the veteran

already owns the land involved, the loan may still be up to \$16,000.00. The term 'veterans of the Armed Forces of the United States' shall include veterans of the Guam Combat Patrol, as certified by the Director of the Department of Public Safety, and those persons captured on Wake Island during the Second World War or the survivors of those who were killed, as certified by the War Claims Commission of the United States. All other loans for the purchase or construction of low-cost homes shall not exceed \$14,000.00, to include herein both the cost of the land and the building, if the borrower must purchase the land, except that no more than \$1,500.00 of such loans may be used for the purchase of land."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
