
CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

Introduced by J. T. Sabian,

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW CHAPTER 15 TO
TITLE IX OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF
GUAM AUTHORIZING BONUSES FOR THOSE
RESIDENTS WHO SERVED AS CIVILIAN
SCOUTS FOR THE U.S. ARMED FORCES
DURING THE LIBERATION OF GUAM.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. A new Chapter 15 is hereby added to Title IX
3 of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

4 "Chapter 15

5 Bonus for Civilian Scouts

6 Section 8990. Creation of bonus. In recognition
7 of the services performed on behalf of the people of
8 Guam by those local residents who served as civilian
9 scouts for the U.S. Armed Forces during the liberation
10 of Guam in the Second World War, which services have
11 never received adequate recognition from either the
12 United States or the territory of Guam, there is
13 hereby authorized to be paid to each such civilian
14 scout, or his survivor or survivors, a bonus in the
15 sum of \$500.00.

16 Section 8991. Eligibility for bonus. Each civilian
17 scout, or his survivor or survivors, shall apply for the
18 bonus to the Director of Public Safety, who upon satis-
19 factory proof that such applicants were civilian scouts
20 or are such a civilian scout's survivor or survivors,
21 shall certify to the Treasurer of Guam the eligibility
22 of such applicants for such bonuses, and the treasurer
23 shall thereupon pay the same to them. The Director of

1 Public Safety shall promulgate, pursuant to the provisions
2 of the Administrative Adjudication Act, such rules and
3 regulations as are required to establish eligibility for
4 such bonus by way of documentary evidence of such
5 civilian scout service, affidavits based on personal
6 knowledge, or such other proof as would establish by a
7 preponderance of the evidence the fact of eligibility
8 for such bonus.

9 Section 8992. No payment to those assisting applicants.
10 No person may charge any fee or collect any commission for
11 assisting an applicant for such bonus to prove eligibility
12 or obtain the bonus. Any contract in violation of this
13 section shall be void, and any person who shall collect
14 any fee or commission in violation of this section shall
15 be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not
16 to exceed \$500 or by imprisonment for not to exceed six
17 months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

18 Section 8993. Members of the Legislature and others
19 ineligible. Notwithstanding any other provision of this
20 Chapter, no member of the Tenth Guam Legislature, and no
21 person who received the bonus under Chapter 14 of this
22 Title, shall be eligible for the bonus authorized herein,
23 but any member of the Legislature otherwise entitled
24 thereto shall in lieu of such bonus be given an appro-
25 priate certificate of appreciation.

26 Section 8994. Authorization for appropriation.
27 There is hereby authorized to be appropriated the sum of
28 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) to pay the bonus
29 authorized by this Chapter."

30 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
