AN ACT TO ADD SECTION 13527.2 TO THE  
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO AUTHORIZE  
THE GOVERNOR TO SELL FOR A NOMINAL  
CONSIDERATION GOVERNMENT LAND TO  
BONA FIDE VETERANS' ORGANIZATIONS IN  
THE TERRITORY OF GUAM.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 13527.2 is hereby added to the Govern-  
3 ment Code of Guam to read as follows:

4 "Section 13527.2. Sale of Land to Bona Fide Veterans'  
5 Organizations. The Governor is authorized to convey to  
6 bona fide veterans' organizations, having duly constituted  
7 lodges or posts within the territory of Guam, government  
8 of Guam real property at a nominal consideration under the  
9 following terms and conditions:

10 1. That any such land so conveyed to a veterans'  
11 organizations shall only used for carrying out  
12 those functions of such organization as are consonant  
13 with its charter and beneficial to its members, and  
14 such land shall never be used for private profit or  
15 for commercial purposes, direct or indirect, except  
16 that such prohibition shall not apply to fund-raising  
17 activities of the veterans' organization carried on  
18 in furtherance of its authorized aims and purposes;

19 2. That whenever such a veterans' organization  
20 ceases to have an active chapter or unit within Guam,  
21 or whenever it ceases utilizing such land for duly  
22 authorized purposes, the same shall thereupon revert  
23 to the government of Guam;

1           3. That the amount of land so conveyed to any  
2 such veterans' organization shall not exceed an area  
3 needed for its specific purposes, and no conveyance  
4 shall be made until such organization shall have sub-  
5 mitted to the Governor for his approval a master  
6 plan showing in detail the proposed use of the land  
7 on a long-term basis;

8           4. That such organization comply with such other  
9 reasonable rules and regulations as the Governor shall  
10 by executive order lawfully prescribe."

11 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
