AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 11810, 11813, AND 11820.1 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO INCREASE THE AMOUNTS OF SCHOLARSHIPS AND STUDENT LOANS UNDER THE GUAM SCHOLARSHIP LAW AND TO LIBERALIZE THE INSTITUTIONAL ELIGIBI-LITY REQUIREMENTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 11810 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 11810. Same: amount. The scholarship herein provided shall be in an amount which shall reasonably cover the cost of room and board, clothing, books, tuition and other school fees, as annually determined by the Board, but not to exceed \$5,000.00 per year, for the period which the recipient needs to complete the requirements or the degree or certificate issued upon graduation by the schools or institutions attended: provided that such period be no longer than the usual period for the fulfilling of the requirements for the said degree or certificate by a student not having the scholarship herein provided but similarly enrolled in the same school or institution. Any student hereunder shall be entitled to a grant to cover the cost of initial transportation to the institution and thereafter he shall be entitled to the travel and transportation privilege set forth in Section 4110.1 of this Code upon the completion of his studies." Section 2. Section 11813 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 11813. Student Loans. The Board is authorized to approve loans to qualified applicants for advanced education beyond the high school level which may be in an amount sufficient to reasonably cover all or any part of the cost of transportation, room and board, clothing, tuition, and other required fees for a period of one academic year in the University of Guam, or in an accredited college, university, or technical or trade school in the United States provided that any such loans shall not exceed Four Thousand Dollars per year and in no case shall the total amount loaned exceed that which the recipient needs to complete the requirements or degree or certificates issued upon graduation by the schools or institutions attended. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, any full-time student, on regular status and having a grade average at time of application of not less than 'C' in financial need, and a bona fide resident of Guam, attending the University of Guam or an accredited college, university or technical school in the United States is deemed to be otherwise qualified to obtain a loan hereunder." Section 3. Section 11820.1 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 11820.1. Limitation on institutions outside of Guam. Government of Guam Scholarships and Student Loans other than those provided in Sections 11821 and 11803 shall be authorized for institutions outside the territory of Guam only upon the certification by the Board that the contemplated course of study is not available within the territory of Guam; provided, however, that for the purpose of this section the Board shall not certify the availability of pre-medicine, pre-dentistry, pre-engineering, and pre-law courses at the University of Guam, and the Board

may certify the non-availability of contemplated courses and studies in Guam if it finds that the particular offisland institution for which authorization is sought offers a course of study more suitable and appropriate for the recipient of the scholarship or student loan than is any such course available in Guam. In carrying out the provisions of this section, the Board shall be guided by the liberal intent of this Chapter which is to encourage the development of professionally trained people for service in Guam."

Section 4. This Act is an urgency measure.
