



AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 11810, 11813,  
AND 11820.1 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF  
GUAM TO INCREASE THE AMOUNTS OF  
SCHOLARSHIPS AND STUDENT LOANS UNDER  
THE GUAM SCHOLARSHIP LAW AND TO  
LIBERALIZE THE INSTITUTIONAL ELIGIBI-  
LITY REQUIREMENTS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 11810 of the Government Code of Guam

3 is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 11810. Same: amount. The scholarship  
5 herein provided shall be in an amount which shall reason-  
6 ably cover the cost of room and board, clothing, books,  
7 tuition and other school fees, as annually determined  
8 by the Board, but not to exceed \$5,000.00 per year, for  
9 the period which the recipient needs to complete the  
10 requirements or the degree or certificate issued upon  
11 graduation by the schools or institutions attended: pro-  
12 vided that such period be no longer than the usual period  
13 for the fulfilling of the requirements for the said degree  
14 or certificate by a student not having the scholarship  
15 herein provided but similarly enrolled in the same school  
16 or institution. Any student hereunder shall be entitled to  
17 a grant to cover the cost of initial transportation to the  
18 institution and thereafter he shall be entitled to the  
19 travel and transportation privilege set forth in Section  
20 4110.1 of this Code upon the completion of his studies."

21 Section 2. Section 11813 of the Government Code of Guam

22 is hereby amended to read as follows:

1           "Section 11813. Student Loans. The Board is authorized  
2 to approve loans to qualified applicants for advanced  
3 education beyond the high school level which may be in an  
4 amount sufficient to reasonably cover all or any part of  
5 the cost of transportation, room and board, clothing,  
6 tuition, and other required fees for a period of one  
7 academic year in the University of Guam, or in an accredited  
8 college, university, or technical or trade school in the  
9 United States provided that any such loans shall not  
10 exceed Four Thousand Dollars per year and in no case shall  
11 the total amount loaned exceed that which the recipient  
12 needs to complete the requirements or degree or certifi-  
13 cates issued upon graduation by the schools or institutions  
14 attended. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, any  
15 full-time student, on regular status and having a grade  
16 average at time of application of not less than 'C' in  
17 financial need, and a bona fide resident of Guam, attending  
18 the University of Guam or an accredited college, university  
19 or technical school in the United States is deemed to be  
20 otherwise qualified to obtain a loan hereunder."

21           Section 3. Section 11820.1 of the Government Code of Guam  
22 is hereby amended to read as follows:

23           "Section 11820.1. Limitation on institutions outside  
24 of Guam. Government of Guam Scholarships and Student Loans  
25 other than those provided in Sections 11821 and 11803 shall  
26 be authorized for institutions outside the territory of  
27 Guam only upon the certification by the Board that the  
28 contemplated course of study is not available within the  
29 territory of Guam; provided, however, that for the purpose  
30 of this section the Board shall not certify the availabi-  
31 lity of pre-medicine, pre-dentistry, pre-engineering, and  
32 pre-law courses at the University of Guam, and the Board

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may certify the non-availability of contemplated courses and studies in Guam if it finds that the particular off-island institution for which authorization is sought offers a course of study more suitable and appropriate for the recipient of the scholarship or student loan than is any such course available in Guam. In carrying out the provisions of this section, the Board shall be guided by the liberal intent of this Chapter which is to encourage the development of professionally trained people for service in Guam."

Section 4. This Act is an urgency measure.
