AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 418 OF THE PENAL CODE OF GUAM TO INCLUDE WITHIN THE DEFINITION OF "FORCIBLE ENTRY AND DETAINER" THE CRIME OF GATE CRASHING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 418 of the Penal Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 418. Forcible entry and detainer; gate crashing. Every person using or procuring, encouraging, or assisting another to use, any force or violence in entering upon or detaining any land or other possessions of another, except in the cases and in the manner allowed by law, is guilty of a misdemeanor. For purposes of this section, the phrase 'any force or violence in entering upon or detaining any land' shall include the willful and uninvited entry into an inhabited dwelling house during the course of a party or other gathering of people therein, except that no person shall be convicted of an offense under this definition unless the owner of the dwelling or the host of the party or any responsible adult, including a peace officer, shall have first requested such uninvited person to leave and he shall fail to do so. "

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
