AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT SECTION 1015 OF THE COVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATING TO THE CONVENING AND ADJOURNING OF LEGISLATIVE SESSIONS AND TO THE CARRY OVER OF BUSINESS, BILLS, AND RESOLUTIONS FROM ODD-YEAR REGULAR SESSIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
Section 1. Section 1015 of the Government Code of Guam
is hereby repealed in its entirety, and a new Section 1015
is hereby enacted to read as follows:

"Section 1015. Legislature: Convening and adjourning of sessions; carry over from odd-year regular sessions.

(a) The Legislature shall convene in regular session at the seat of government at 5 p.m. on the second Monday in January of each year.

- (b) A session, either regular or special, shall adjourn without day at 12 midnight or earlier on a day determined by resolution of the Legislature.
- (c) Any business, bill, or resolution pending at the final adjournment of a regular session held in an odd-numbered year shall carry over with the same status to the next regular session."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
