


CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE A FEASIBILITY STUDY
TO BE MADE OF IRRIGATION SOURCES IN GUAM.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Title of Act. This Act may be known as the
3 "Irrigation Feasibility Act of 1971".

4 Section 2. Definitions. As used in this Act, unless
5 otherwise indicated,

6 (a) "Director" means the Director of Agriculture;

7 (b) "Contractor" means a person, firm, corporation,
8 partnership or other business organization that
9 is qualified to conduct a scientific study of
10 irrigation sources in Guam, such qualification
11 to be established by no less than five years
12 experience in the field and proof of having
13 conducted successfully other irrigation
14 feasibility studies;

15 (c) "Irrigation" means the application of water
16 to soil for the purpose of supplying the
17 moisture essential for plant growth.

1 Section 3. Statement of findings. The Legislature finds
2 that the territory is dangerously dependent on outside sources
3 for its essential food supplies, that there is a considerable
4 acreage of land available for agricultural purposes in Guam if
5 suitable crops can be grown thereon, that the lack of irrigation
6 inhibits the productive use of the idle agricultural land on
7 Guam, and that therefore determining whether irrigation can be
8 feasibly increased in Guam is in the public interest.

9 Section 4. Authorization for feasibility study. The
10 Governor is authorized to cause to be undertaken a feasibility
11 study of irrigation sources in Guam, such study to include the
12 following:

13 (a) The location of sources of irrigation waters,
14 including the estimated quantities available from such
15 sources and the cost of developing them;

16 (b) Methods of transmitting and distributing such
17 irrigation waters to agricultural areas, including the
18 estimated costs of such distribution systems;

19 (c) A geological-geophysical survey and report
20 covering the entire territory and delimiting Guam's
21 water sources.

22 Section 5. Report to the Legislature. The Governor shall
23 submit a report on the results of such study to the Legislature
24 within eight (8) months from the effective date of this Act.

25 Section 6. Authorization of appropriation. There is
26 hereby authorized to be appropriated the sum of \$25,000 to carry
27 out the provisions of this Act.

28 Section 7. Urgency clause. This Act is an urgency
29 measure.
