AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 200 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO DECLARE DECEMBER 8 A LEGAL HOLIDAY.

WHEREAS, the Roman Catholic faith has played a predominant role in the cultural life of the people of Guam since the 17th century, the Chamorro culture as it now exists being so inextricably intertwined with Catholic beliefs and practices as to be almost empty of content were the Catholic tradition to be ignored; and

WHEREAS, playing a central role in this tradition is the figure of the Blessed Virgin Mary, particularly in her local manifestation as our Lady of Camarin, a tradition that goes back to the very beginning of Christian history of Guam, the whole island being dedicated to Saint Mary, and the principal Feast Day of this Saint, December 8th of each year, being a territorial holy day of practically universal observance since time immemorial; and WHEREAS, in addition, December 8, 1941, was that day of infamy when Guam was invaded by Imperial Japan and the three long years of enemy oppression commenced, Guam being the only inhabited American community to suffer such an occupation during the Second World War, the memory of those who made the supreme sacrifice on their country's behalf being so sacred as to require eternal commemoration; and

WHEREAS, it is therefore the consensus of the Legislature that December 8th in each year should be made a territorial legal holiday in celebration both of the Chamorro traditions of Guam and in commemoration of those who lost their lives during the long night of enemy occupation; now therefore

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Subsection (m) and (n) of Section 200 of the Government Code of Guam are hereby renumbered Subsections (n) and (o), respectively, and a new Subsection (m) is hereby added

to said section to read as follows:
