




AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE
ACQUISITION OF A NEW GUAM MEMORIAL
HOSPITAL COMPLEX SITE AND FOR THE
PRELIMINARY SCHEMATIC DRAWINGS OF
SUCH A NEW COMPLEX.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from any available
3 funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum
4 of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) to the Land
5 Acquisition Fund for the acquisition of land needed for a new
6 Guam Memorial Hospital Complex.

7 Section 2. There is hereby appropriated from any available
8 funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum
9 of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) for schematic
10 drawings of said new Guam Memorial Hospital Complex. No portion
11 of the appropriation made by this section may be obligated or
12 spent without the approval of the Board of Trustees of the Guam
13 Memorial Hospital.

14 Section 3. This Act is an urgency measure.
