



CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

AN ACT MAKING SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION FOR
THE OPERATION OF THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH OF THE
GOVERNMENT OF GUAM FOR FISCAL YEAR ENDING
JUNE 30, 1971, AND FOR THE PURCHASE OF AMBU-
LANCE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

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28 Section 3. There is hereby appropriated from any available
 29 funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum
 30 of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) for the purpose of replacing
 31 ambulances that have been declared surplus by the government of
 32 Guam.

1 Section 4. The digest and analysis of this Act prepared by
2 the Guam Legislature is attached hereto and is incorporated herein
3 as a recital preceding the enactment clause for the purpose of
4 assisting in the interpretation of this Act.

5 Section 5. This Act is an urgency measure.
