

Bill No. 144

Introduced by J. A. Perez

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 6610.4 OF THE GOVERNMENT  
CODE OF GUAM TO INCREASE THE PER DIEM TRAVEL  
ALLOWANCE.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 6610.4 of the Government Code of Guam is  
3 hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 6610.4. Per diem allowance. Any  
5 employee, and his dependents, including a spouse as  
6 authorized by item (c) of Section 6610.3, while travel-  
7 ing on official business and away from the designated  
8 post of duty of such employee, shall be allowed, in lieu  
9 of their actual expenses or subsistence, a per diem  
10 allowance in an amount prescribed according to regula-  
11 tions, but not to exceed \$20.00, except that the Governor,  
12 the Lieutenant Governor, the judges of the Island Court,  
13 and members of the Legislature shall be allowed \$50.00,  
14 and the directors and executive heads of the various  
15 departments and agencies of the government of Guam, and  
16 such other officials as the Governor shall authorize  
17 shall be allowed \$40.00. Guam's Washington Representative  
18 shall also be allowed a per diem allowance of \$50.00  
19 while traveling on official business and away from  
20 Washington, D. C., except when he is in Guam."
