

AN ACT TO REPEAL SECTION 37001, CHAPTER 1,
TITLE XXXIII, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM,
RELATIVE TO MILITIA EMPLOYEES UNDER THE
WORKERS' COMPENSATION LAW, AND FOR OTHER
PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 37001, Chapter 1, Title XXXIII, Govern-
3 ment Code of Guam, is hereby repealed in its entirety.

4 Section 2. There is hereby appropriated from any available
5 surplus of the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund of the
6 government of Guam the sum of One Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand
7 Dollars (\$175,000) for the revaluation of the appraised value
8 of all real property in Guam pursuant to the provisions of
9 Section 19312.1; provided, however, that the assessment based on
10 such revaluation shall become effective on March 1973.

11 Section 3. No part or portion of the appropriation made by
12 Section 2 shall be used to pay for salary increases, for the
13 employment of additional employees, or for the payment of any
14 contract which is not contemplated by this Bill without the
15 concurrence of the Legislature as a whole, or the Committee on
16 Rules of the Eleventh Guam Legislature in extreme emergency
17 cases.
