AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 15102 OF THE GOVERN-
MENT CODE OF GUAM RELATING TO THE DUTIES OF
THE WASHINGTON REPRESENTATIVE.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 15102 of the Government Code of Guam is
3 hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 15102. Same: duties. The Washington
5 Representative, elected as provided in Section 15100 of
6 this Chapter, shall maintain an office headquarters in
7 Washington, D. C., for the purpose of representing the
8 people of Guam in the National Capitol on a full-time
9 basis, before the Congress of the United States and
10 the departments and agencies of the Federal government
11 on all matters pertaining to Guam and its people.
12 He shall assist the members of the Legislature and the
13 officers of the Executive Branch of the government of
14 Guam in all matters respecting or pertinent to relation-
15 ships between the Federal government and the government
16 of Guam, and shall support, advocate, and further in the
17 Nation's Capitol the policies and programs of the people
18 of Guam. The Legislature and the Executive Branch shall
19 inform fully and promptly the Washington Representative
20 of all policy decisions, programs, and contemplated
21 actions involving relationships between the Federal
22 government and the government of Guam and its people.
23 The Washington Representative shall report annually in
24 person during the month of June to the people of Guam
25 before the Legislature, and said report shall be printed
26 as a public document. He shall actively advocate at
27 Washington, D. C. all programs and policies duly adopted
28 by the Guam Legislature."
